1. A general sales tax, food and medicine excepted, the revenue to be used for relief and welfare purposes. That has worked well in New York City, hasn't it? And it would relieve real estate, and consequently the building industry, of much of the relief burden now borne in Westchester.

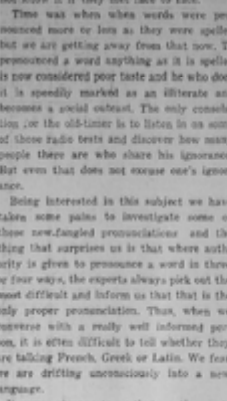
2. A tax on all patented, trademarked or copyrighted articles. This is a sharing with the government of the privileges which come from a monopolistic production under the patent laws; it asks that industry share with the government its profits which the government alone, through patent protection, makes possible.

3. A tax on chain stores. This has been widely debated and has not always worked well in other states. It is undoubtedly proposed as an aid to the local merchant.

4. Legislation of the pari-mutuel system of betting at recognized race tracks. This has worked in other states to the great financial benefit of the state. It is proven practically crook-proof. It is fought, principally, in this state by the professional gamblers who themselves "make book" and whose livelihood would be endangered were this bill passed.

5. That the state take over maintenance of Westchester County Parkways, and if this is not done, that the county install tolls, as is done by New York City at various points on its new parkway system. This state maintenance has already been recommended by a joint legislative committee "in fairness to Westchester." And if the second alternative be necessary, there is plenty of precedent in the policy of New York City's Park Department.

The passing leaves a void in the hearts of many and his successful self-made career may well serve to inspire younger men.

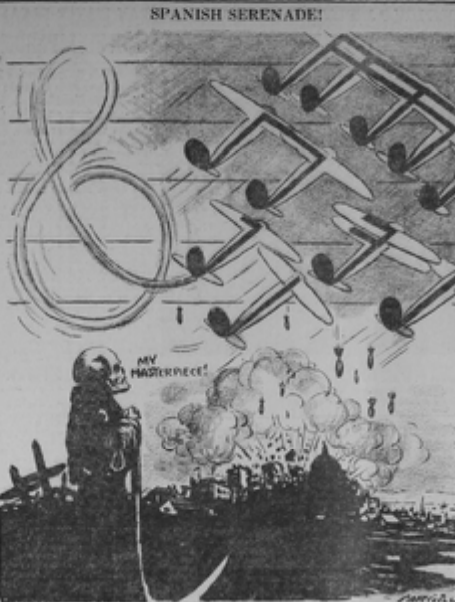

LARCHMONT POLITICAL TRENDS

Anyone knows that many times a growing child can eat more than an adult of course I would probably be enough if it were just the one child but out of that I must buy coffee, sugar, salt and butter. They eat on just about \$2.00 a week. Two of us eat remain so happy for very long on that amount. I work special hardship on men working at hard labor and on growing children. To provide adequate nutrition for them on that amount of money means that every cent must be protected by the mother and protect the body. If you had said that after you had taught the growth of your three children that you had very little left to provide the other foods which they need it would be a point that nobody could argue.
