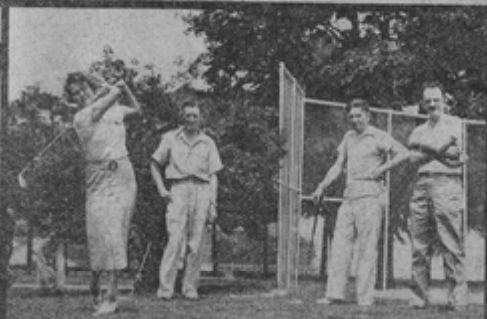


THEY'RE IN THE ARMY NOW

Fort Slocum at New Rochelle is Westchester's only post. Through it every year pass 10,000 recruits trained for service in Hawaii, the Philippines or Panama. The post is situated on historic David's Island, was used as a hospital during the Civil War and later fortified. Its permanent staff totals more than 400 officers and men commanded by Colonel Edwin Gunner. CARINO PLAYS 235 HOLES TO SET NEW MARATHON RECORD

New Rochelle Golfer Covers 50 Miles in Trek At Broadmoor Club

They are calling old-skinned, sturdy Frank Carino, former marathoner, an iron man today in Watchtower following his record breaking trek yesterday at Broadmoor Golf Club, New Rochelle, where he played 235 consecutive holes of golf from sunrise to sunset. He shattered the mark of 231 claimed by John Curran of New York City on a Long Island course last week.

Showing stamina and determination which made him an entrant each year for three years in the annual Port Chester marathon and other outstanding golf events, Carino is believed to have covered nearly 50 miles of rolling terrain in his trek uphill and down dale. Before the sun was over the rim of the Eastern horizon he was on his way yesterday morning, shooting with the aid of a winking berserker lantern held by a caddy and putting in the glowing light of two automobile headlights.

The darkness did not faze him and he finished the first 18 holes as the sun bathed the country in golden light with a 78 after that for 12 more consecutive rounds. He talked over the green and fairway, taking time out for only half an hour at 1 P. M. for a brief bite to eat and a let-down.

At that time he said he was not tired and the way he punched out his hole indicated the strain if any, was not telling too harshly on him. He collected 18 birdies, one eagle—the latter on the 10th, par five hole—during the day. His average for 235 holes was 78 and 11-13 and he had a best ball record of 12 under par for the total number of rounds.

Carino never went above 83 on any round and he only went that high twice, on the 6th round and again on the 13th. He played one more hole after the last on the 13th round, negotiating the first hole once again and taking a 94 8 in semi-darkness.

Evidence of his excellent control on his shot, were shown when Dominick Coyle displayed the original tee which Carino used on his opening blast in the early hours of the morning. His driver was straight and true but his short game, possibly because he did not take as much time as usual, was off. Many a putt flamed the cup while others hung on the brink.

In the locker rooms following his record-breaking performance Frank was mobbed by well-wishers. Leonard Talner, New Rochelle business man presented him with a handsome trophy emblematic of his feat and he received a big kiss from Mrs. Ella Robinson, women's champion of Broadmoor.

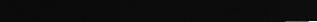
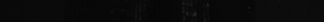

DAVIS TAKES STAND, TELLS OF VISIT WITH SCHULTZ ON HINES

'Kid Mouthpiece' Testifies Leader Took Money
GAVE HIM \$2,000

NEW YORK, Aug. 31 (AP)—Richard (Dickie) Davis, 32-year-old "kid mouthpiece" of the old Dutch Schultz mob, testified today in the policy racket conspiracy trial of Tammany District Leader James J. Hines that he had visited Hines at his home in company with Schultz.

"In the fall of 1928 I did give Hines money," said Davis. "I did not know Hines until then. I told Hines I meant to handle money for him. He gave me \$2,000."

The dapper young lawyer, dressed in his customary suit, testified after his examination with the two-million dollar Schultz policy racket before him, took the stand after John F. Curtz, deputy boss of Tammany Hall, had testified under cross-examination of his long-standing feud with Hines.

Hines is accused of giving public protection to the Schultz gang. "I did not know Hines until he was in the hospital of Tammany Hall," Curtz said. "I have never seen him since then."

Curtz had "put the English" on Hines yesterday in an admitted agreement as a state witness, according to Hines' attorney, the District Attorney in 1931 and that since that time Hines, who reportedly got into to arrange the "kidney" protection from his Westport place.

Davis, in a straightforward manner, told his story in a simple, matter-of-fact way. He said he was graduated from the University of Pennsylvania in 1924. He was a member of the Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society.

"I worked in a bank in the city," he said.

The evidence "Kid Mouthpiece," a figure of swinging and dancing during the past few years, said Schultz said, appeared in it again. Only once did Davis look at Hines. It was a quick, furtive glance, easily returned by the 44-year-old politician, who said he "didn't know who he was."
