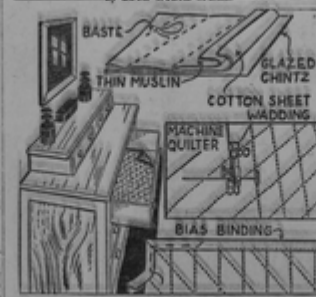

LARCHMONT BOARD ORDERS PROBE OF SUTTON'S CHARGES

District Attorney Asked To Determine Whether Accusations Are Libelous

TRUSTEES RESENT HINTS

Corporation Counsel To Confer With Ferris; Broker Refuses To Answer Query

Larchmont Village Board of Trustees, incensed at allegations directed at the board and written for public consumption by Thomas B. Sutton, real estate broker, today had ordered William McWilliams, corporation counsel, to determine whether the statements made by Mr. Sutton are libelous.

The order was based on a resolution adopted by the Village Board. Mr. McWilliams was expected to discuss the matter today with Walter B. Ferris, district attorney in White Plains.

The resolution was adopted as Mr. Sutton was pressed with opposition on two other fronts at last night's Village Board meeting and public hearing in Municipal Building.

Trustee Vincent Cullen moved the resolution, saying: "Anyone in this democratic country has the right to question any public official. But I do not believe that anyone has the right to insinuate corruption and dishonesty without the slightest basis of fact."

"Any citizen may have the right to question my knowledge and my judgment but he cannot question my honesty and get away with it. The full membership of this board of Trustees voted unanimously to purchase the Abram-Fox property as a large saving to the taxpayers."

Mr. Cullen was referring to the Abram-Fox fire engine recently purchased by the Village Board in his private publication. Mr. Sutton last week questioned the method of purchase in terms which village board members deemed bordered on the libelous.

MUSICIA'S DEALS LINKED TO CHINA

Huge Arms and Munitions Order Believed Destined For Chiang-Kai-Shek

NEW YORK, Dec. 20 (AP)—Federal authorities, delving into the fantastic story that Philip Mason, as P. Donald Carter, respected president of McClelland and Robbins, Inc., tried to sell 2,000,000 rifles and 100,000,000 rounds of ammunition to some unidentified nation, turned today to a report they might have been destined for the Chinese general, Chiang Kai-Shek.

Under questioning by Gregory P. Noonan, acting U. S. attorney and other federal officials, was Thomas A. Brunl, a promoter and Frederick Winer, a vice president in charge of law and labor relations for the \$7,000,000 drug firm which Oster-Musica dominated.

The New York post had Brunl told the federal authorities he was approached last spring by agents of the Chinese general and got in touch with Ben Simon, of the Bronx, a promoter who acted at different times for McClelland and Robbins.

Simon's name was injected into the investigation yesterday by Winer, who disclosed that Oster-Musica had asked him last May to draw a contract for the purchase of 2,000,000 new Lee-Enfield rifles and the cartridges.

NEW YORK MAYOR STRUCK DOWN ON CITY HALL STEPS

LaGuardia Slugged From Behind As He Enters Manhattan Office

ASSAILANT IS CAPTURED

Executive's Attacker Believed Disappointed Office Seeker

NEW YORK, Dec. 20 (AP)—E. M. LaGuardia was slugged today as he mounted the City Hall steps by a heavy-set gray-haired man relatively identified as J. Hagen. The assailant, who leaped upon the mayor from behind and struck him down with the blow of his fist, was set upon by bystanders and police and beaten senseless.

"He was bounding me for four years," said the mayor. He did not amplify but the remark led Hagen to employ to suppose that Hagen was a disappointed office-seeker.

The attack occurred in the presence of hundreds of persons gathered in and near the City Hall Plaza, which commemorates the old federal building.

The mayor was immediately set upon by police and bystanders and beaten senseless.

There was no immediate explanation of the assault upon the mayor.

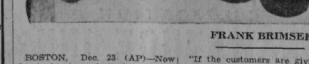

Government forces were concentrated at the textile town of Artesa, on the northern sector of the insurgent offensive into Catalonia.

SUPERVISORS ACT ON 1939 BUDGET

County Board Not Expected To Alter Figures At Session Tomorrow

WHITE PLAINS, Dec. 28.—Westchester's 1939 county budget of \$120,000,000, along with \$30,000,000 for capital improvements and \$3,413,754 for district budgetary charges, is expected to be adopted tomorrow afternoon when the supervisors meet in special session here.

While there may be some alterations made in the document by the budget committee tomorrow morning, the figures are not expected to be altered materially.

Both Republican and Democratic members will caucus before the session. The two-party caucus is expected to oppose a number of items but because of their minority position, it is not anticipated they will be able to amend the budget in any manner.

There is a possibility that the 1939 tax equalization plan may also be brought in tomorrow and made a special order of business, perhaps for Friday, in order to pass the table during 1938. It was learned today.

Some discussion has been reported from the equalization committee on towns whose assessors have dropped from their taxable lists the properties on which tax liens have been foreclosed and bought in by the towns. There are contrary opinions as to whether such properties are really tax exempt.

The equalization committee, as has already been indicated by the budget committee in fixing the county tax rate for 1939, is expected to report a drop in assessed realty valuations in the county during 1938 approximating \$20,000,000. This would bring the total 1939 tax proceeds to around \$154,600,000.

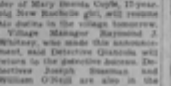

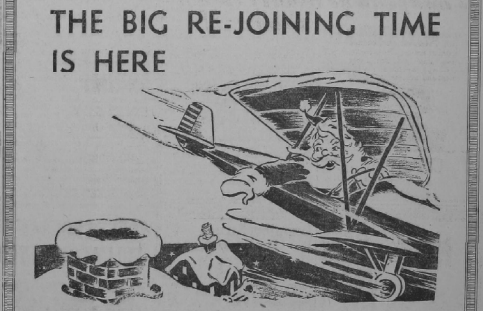

Westchester In Review



COUNTY EXECUTIVE. Highlight of the 1938 year in Westchester was election of former Supreme Court Justice William F. Blawie of Yonkers as First County Executive. J. A. Blawie led a Republican sweep in the county which shattered all previous sagas. At the same time, Yonkers voters approved the City Manager form of government.



NATURE'S WRATH. The heaves poured down on Westchester for almost a full week in mid-July, causing widespread floods and resulting in losses from stalled autos like the one below in Etonville. Then on Sept. 23 a tropical hurricane lashed the county from the Sound, felled thousands of venerable trees and wrecked scores of cars (above).



ANNIVERSARY. New Rochelle, "Queen City of the Sound," celebrated its 250th anniversary of its founding by the Huguenots during June. Climax of the festivities was a mammoth parade, shown above passing the reviewing stand at City Hall.



MIRACLES. Crisis took the county's attention in January when contact with the kidnapers of Arthur Fyrd (left), well-to-do White Plains resident, failed. New York gamblers were later alleged to have enticed crossing him. On Feb. 24 Peter Lucini (center), twelve-year-old New Rochelle school boy, was abducted while on his way home from school. Kidnapers asked \$25,000 but his frantic parents were never able to make contact with the kidnapers. Two young extraterrests were revealed in the moon-walk that the boy's head body was emitted above at Devonport State May 23. On Oct. 11 Mary Martha Cagle (right), seventeen, was killed as a passenger in New Rochelle, was found broken in death in Larchmont. The Levin, C. C. K. remains are unexplained.



BAND. The Nazi march and Old Glory saved all-night of Westchester German-Americans who assembled at County Center, White Plains, in a German Day from April 24. White points paraded outside, Hitlerite speeches and vehicles were interrupted by church leaders. The Nazi banners and American flags are hoisted in front of the assembly above. Widespread reflection of the meeting resulted and similar assemblies were banned.
