World's Fair Makes Debut; Size Of First Day Crowd Closely Guarded Mystery

NEW YORK (AP)—New York's \$100,000,000 World's Fair, which took three years to build, is here at last.

The greatest international exposition in history—two square miles of Long Island embracing 200 gleaming buildings, 50 miles of roads and 25,000 employees—opened its gates yesterday to several hundred thousand visitors.

President Roosevelt headed a nationwide program of inaugural ceremonies coming down the Hudson to proclaim the Fair to be the greatest spirit of friendship and peace toward all the world.

One of the most popular attractions was the "Theme Center," the "Fulton and Peckham"—a 700-foot, needle-like pyramid headed at 90-degree angles, the largest globe ever built by man. Within the sphere spectators get an endless look and view in hour round the rim of the fair's future.

The grandstand, which received the bulk of the Fair's audience yesterday, was almost beyond its strength, the amusement area (it) was uncomprehendingly principal seating feature being a two-level one.

Most of the rest of the fair was ready, and fair officials said the gates would be virtually complete in two weeks.

GREEN SEEKS NEW U. S. LABOR BOARD

Federation Head Accuses NLRB Of Distorting Wagner Act

WASHINGTON (AP)—Charging that the National Labor Relations Board has distorted the Wagner Act into an instrument of oppression, President William Green of the American Federation of Labor recommended today that the three-member body be disbanded by a new five-member "Federal Labor Board."

Appearing before the Senate Labor Committee, Green also testified in support of AF of L, urging the Senate to support the Wagner Act as amended by Senator Wagner, D. Maine.

Among other things, these amendments would broaden the right to appeal labor board decisions to the courts, would permit the board's power to investigate labor contract, and would permit employees to petition for execution to determine which union should be recognized.

"Stated generally," Green said, "our opposition to the board is that in deciding cases it has established procedures whereby the so-called economic autonomy of one labor group is encouraged and established while that of another is suppressed or even obliterated."

The board has been called an "ideological confederacy" and has rendered decisions which promote the rivalry of the American Federation of Labor to the injury and detriment of the American Federation of Labor.

CHARTERED BOAT OPENS WORLD'S FAIR FERRY

"Good-Will" Flies To Visit Fair After Catching Up On Their Sleep

NEW YORK (AP)—Two durable Russian flyers whose nonstop "good will" flight from Moscow to New York City was suspended to give it a try on a nearby island off New Brunswick, landed today at the Soviet Consulate.

The aircraft tried to fly from Moscow to North America via the Atlantic route in a single hop, planned after catching up on their sleep to visit the Fair grounds here this afternoon.

Brig. Gen. Vladimir Kokhalev, the pilot and his navigator, Major Mikhail Gromov, were met on their arrival at Ford Bennett Airport last night to discuss details of their forced landing Friday night on Miscou Island, N. B.

It was a difficult flight—the radio compass froze—the fog was very bad, Kokhalev said briefly.

POLAND MOVES TO SHOWDOWN WITH GERMANY

Hitler Proclaims Reich One Of World's Most-Heavily Armed Nations

(By The Associated Press)

Whoever dares to step on the May Day keynote today and Poland over the Frey City Council and the Polish Corridor apparently from closer to a showdown in German demands.

In Berlin, Reichsfuehrer Hitler proclaimed Germany one of the "most heavily armed nations of the world" and Nazi diplomats pressed efforts to isolate Poland to make the case for yielding to German demands.

Reichsfuehrer Hitler stated her annual May Day show in Moscow with emphasis on her military preparations. Artillery and tanks thundered by and the bayonets of ten thousand soldiers were planted in the biggest military display the Red Square ever has seen.

Hitler's speech was a direct appeal to the thousands of his own people who are in the throes of a hard struggle to be destroyed, declared Soviet Defense Commissioner Klimentieff V. Voroshiloff.

France's authoritative source said Premier Daladier and Minister J. L. Chamberlain had urged Poland to strengthen French air force as a counterpart to British equipment of her army and plan for military cooperation.

In London, Foreign Secretary Viscount Halifax placed Poland's reaction to Hitler's speech before the Cabinet and was reported to have said British negotiations to bring about peace in the West would not be "making excellent progress."

The possibility was raised in Warsaw that Poland might seek cooperation with Germany against German imperialism toward peaceful annexation.

Articles in the official German press were interpreted as meaning that Poland might ask the League of Nations—the nominal administrator of Danzig—to transfer certain of its rights to the Polish Government.

It followed reports that Hitler had backed up his demands for return of the Polish Corridor to East Prussia, with specific details of what he wants.

Hitler made two May Day speeches, taking occasion to strike at American action against German emigration.

"The United States has organized a boycott against German goods," he declared. "It would have been better to import German goods than German emigrants."

He told Berlin's Hitler youth, "If the hour should come when the world believes it can reach out at Germany's freedom, then a million cry will arise, so tremendous, that the world will know unmistakably that the time of Germany's weakness is definitely past."

To a labor front mass meeting he said "international agitators" were "working against Germany with all their means and in an arm's length Germany with all my means."

Deep Trolling Rig Method Suggested

Recently I was asked for a suggestion on deep trolling rig for lake trout and salmon that are being taken in Rye and Kenosia lakes. Since the introduction of these game fish we have come to know that they are thriving and growing to large lengths and heavy weights.

The best way to rig, from my experience, follows: This method was given to me by an old Maine guide. Where he got it, I don't know, but I was under the impression it is a new method. The system involves two lines. The fish, since it takes the line and is hooked, has no need to carry and can give out a good battle. If the angler is fortunate to hook him, he can be in for a surprise.

A later or salmon pull up a worthwhile story. If he is given half a chance to do so, a braided copper line or No. 2 line is the lead weight in lead. At the end of the line, heavy enough to take the line straight when he reaches the bottom, is the required depth. About 10 feet above the snags, a small weight is attached so that it is permanently secure.

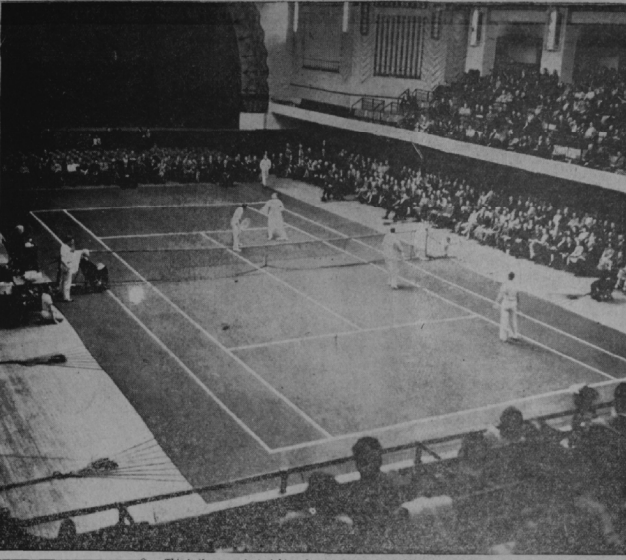

LEGAL QUESTIONS RAISED

Whether or not legal steps will be taken to test the validity of the adoption of the Mamaroneck-Larchmont school district budget has not been determined but that move is to be urged upon the Taxpayers League of Larchmont and Mamaroneck by Orson A. Raynor, Town attorney.

This newspaper has also published another letter received from Major William Harvey Smith, who was apparently not too favorably impressed by what transpired at the meeting and who offers some constructive suggestions for the conduct of similar meetings in the future.

Both letters are fairly representative of a considerable under-current of thought which has followed the result of the meeting with us, a considerable proportion of those who were for the budget, regret much that transpired at the meeting and the failure to apply recognized parliamentary rules in the conduct of the meeting.

Certainly a meeting where so much disorder had prevailed was no place to register a viva voce vote. Had there been but few dissenting votes, the issue might perhaps have been left to such a vote but the sentiment was too evenly divided to make such a test a fair one. In the excitement and chaos, almost any measure had voted and there seems to be good reason to believe as Mr. Raynor points out that many did vote who were not qualified to vote.

Mr. Raynor goes deeply into other legal questions and builds up what will seem to many a rather substantial case against the budget. How far protests may go and whether or not a legal attack against the budget is brought, the communications of Mr. Raynor and Mr. Smith should advise in all of us a determination never to let anything like this happen in the community again.

"PATERNALITIS VIRIDANS"

The County Medical Society is frank in its opposition to socialized medicine, that is, governmental control of health. And if there is any medical society in the State of New York which is justified in such opposition, it is the Westchester group.

"We discern, to our deep dismay, a rapidly increasing tendency on the part of parents to delegate to public agencies many responsibilities concerning their children, which by all the rules of time and reason belong solely to the parents themselves."

"We suppose these parents would rise up and smite any long-haired visionary who proclaimed that all children are essentially the wards and property of the state, and that parents are entrusted with the rearing of their offspring only at the pleasure of the state."

"Yet we suggest that the attitude of many parents today with reference to the health supervision of their children is building a case for someone who in the not-too-distant future will proclaim the triumph of paternalitis viridans. We feel the tendency has gone quite far enough!"

"(Amen) can be said to that logic, not only from the standpoint of health but of practically all other services which must be rendered children in this age. For it is true that an alarmingly increasing number of parents are turning over to others, either in or out of the government, the training of children which older generations felt to belong at home."

The motion picture has been adopted by many parents as the tutor of their children, because it takes them away and their elders "can have a little peace". The radio is another substitute for parental entertainment and guidance, with the youngsters taking their stories from crime-busters and cowboy-adventurers instead of at mother's knee.

Ask any judge of a children's court, any probation officer, the one cause of juvenile delinquency which he considers most harmful and he is almost certain to reply that it is the growing lack of education of children in the home by their parents as essential principles of right and of decency.

The county medical society isn't far wrong in its diagnosis.

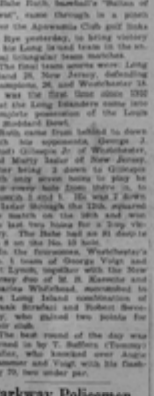

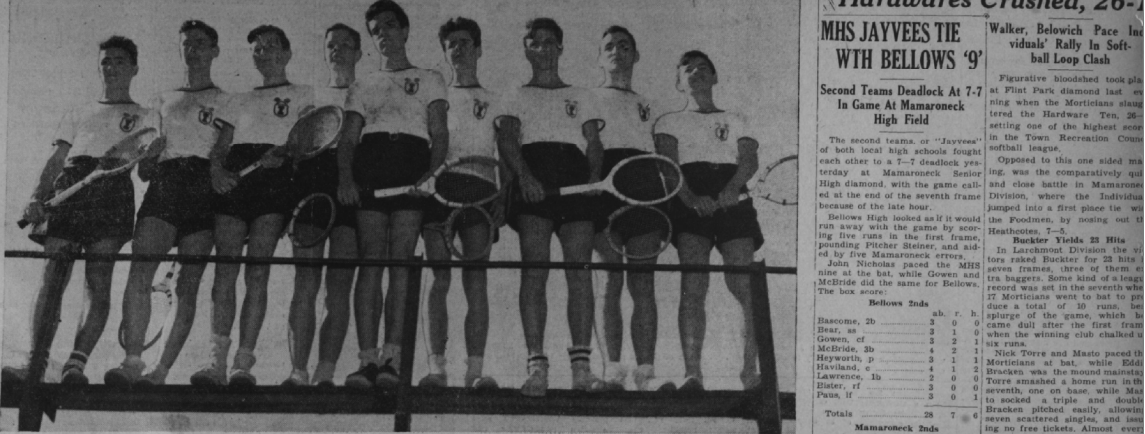
