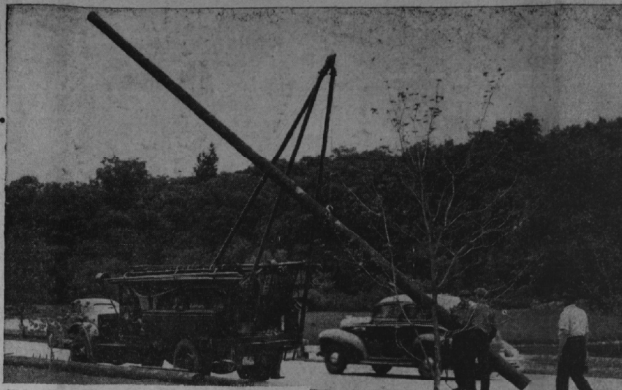

Japan, confident that "the British must carry the burden of finding a peace formula," today strengthened her blockade of Tientsin and let it be known there would be no "backing down" in the issue over the International Settlement at Amoy.

The statement in Washington by Secretary of State Cordell Hull of the United States' concern with the evacuation of Tientsin was a statement which was not a newspaper comment in Tokyo.

For the second successive day the Japanese naval blockade at Kailueng, International Settlement, Amoy, and other ports in the vicinity of the British Eastern Fleet official Tokyo newspaper, convinced that Washington would remain outside the controversy unless asked by both sides to mediate.

British and American officials in Tokyo said that the Japanese Foreign Office has indicated that Japan is not prepared to discuss the Tientsin situation. It said that the Japanese government has expressed its opposition to the American position of the China issue before Emperor Hirohito.

For the second successive day British Cabinet ministers met to consider the Japanese naval blockade of Tientsin, which was being used as an explanation of Japan's intentions before taking any retaliatory action in what started as a local dispute over Japanese demands for control of four Chinese ports.

Informed sources in London, however, said the blockade was being used as a test of power and prestige in Asia.

With the British and French blockade, Japan added another difficulty to the existence of 1,500 besieged Britons at Tientsin. In other words, it is feared that the Chinese municipal employees.

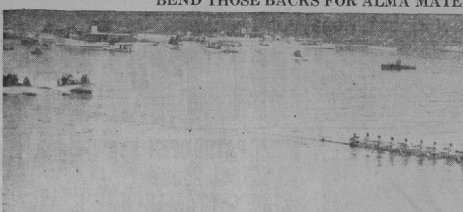

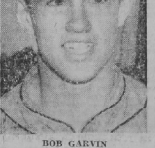

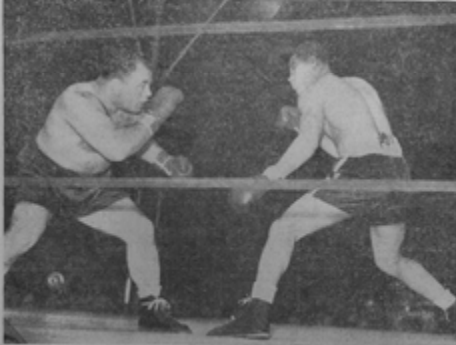

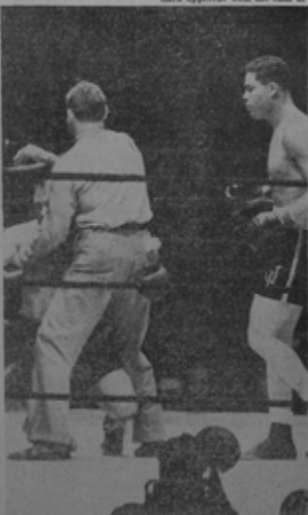

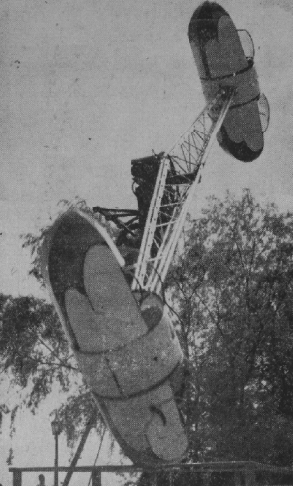
