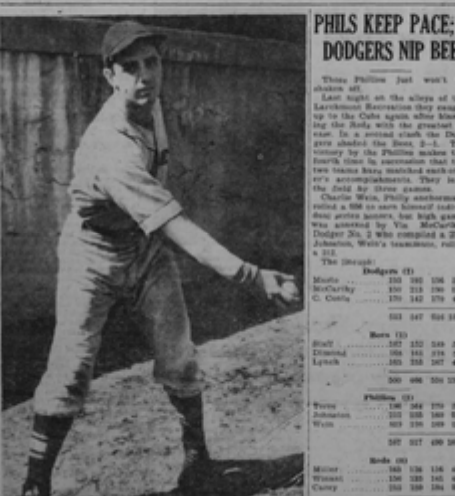

HARRISON ZONING CODE CHALLENGED

Acre Requirement For Sterling Ridge Residences Faces Court Test

A Harrison zoning ordinance, requiring that residences in the Sterling Ridge area of the town be built on one acre of ground and be two and one-half stories in height, will be challenged in Supreme Court next week by Samuel N. and Jay M. Mosher, both of the town.

The Mosher brothers, who own a 45-acre farm from their father, William A. Mosher, and now seek to build a residence on one acre of the property. The action is to compel Building Inspector David R. Taylor to issue a permit for the construction of the house on Pleasant Ridge Road.

The permit was refused by the town because Samuel Mosher's plan called for the construction of a two-story house on one-third of an acre, and Jay Mosher's plan for the erection of a two and one-half story house on one-third of an acre.

Samuel Pale, counsel for the Mosher brothers, said the zoning ordinance on the ground that it is illegal and invalid in that it requires an excessive amount of land for the health and welfare of residents and seeks to take the place of private restrictions.

Alfred Bels, deputy town counsel and Supervisor Benjamin I. Taylor appeared for the town. Mr. Taylor stated that 99 out of 100 residents of the neighborhood approve of the ordinance.
