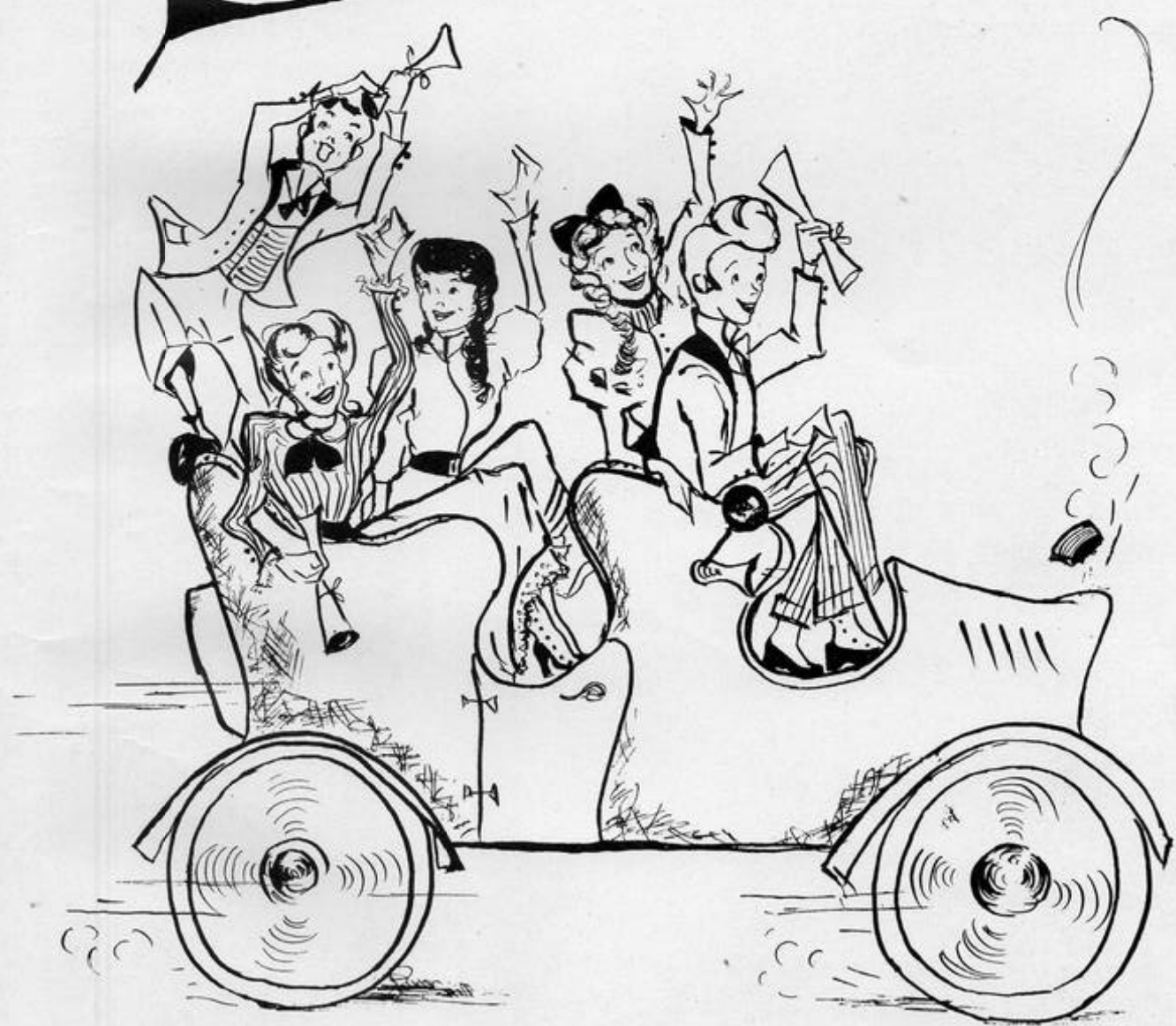

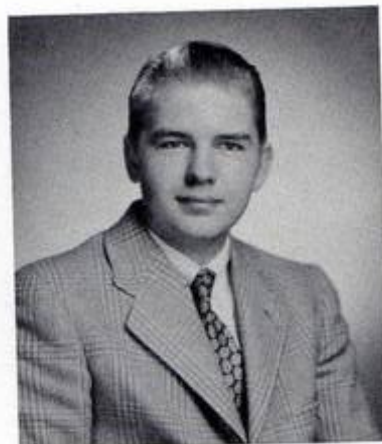

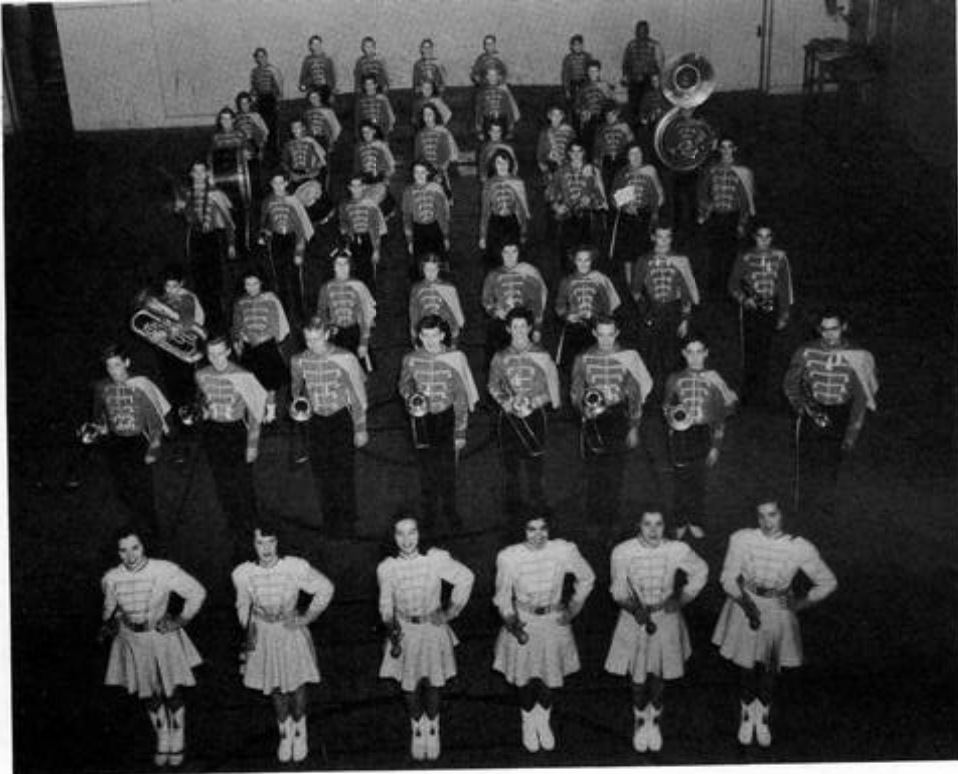


GUNTHER T. WESTPHAL

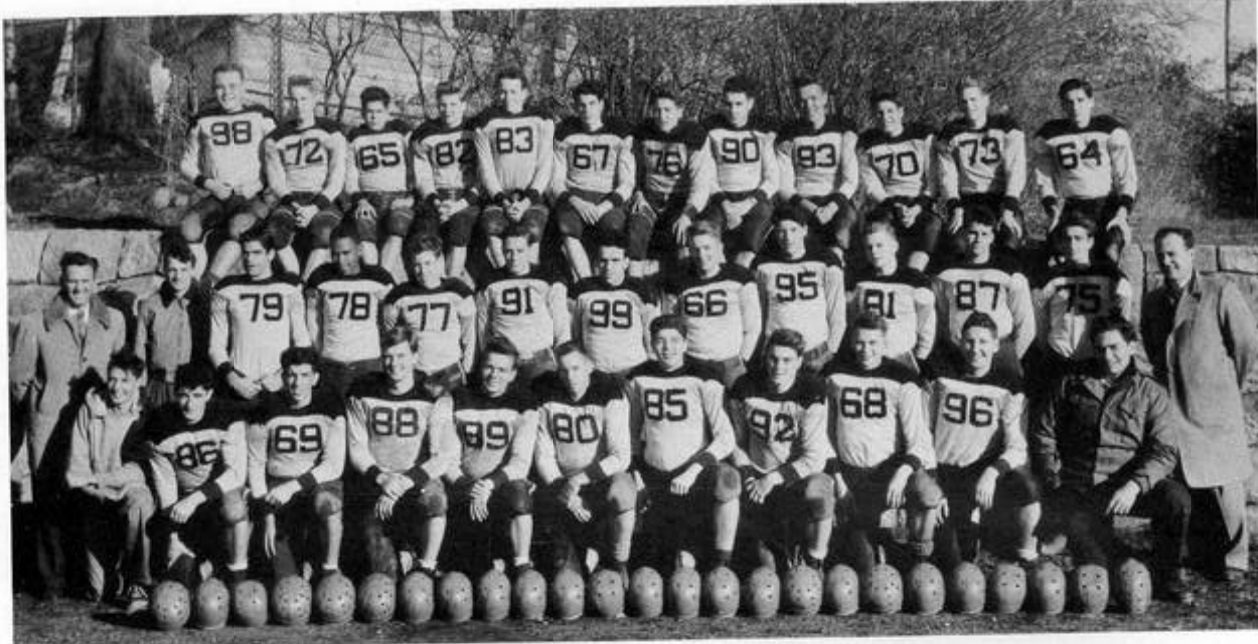

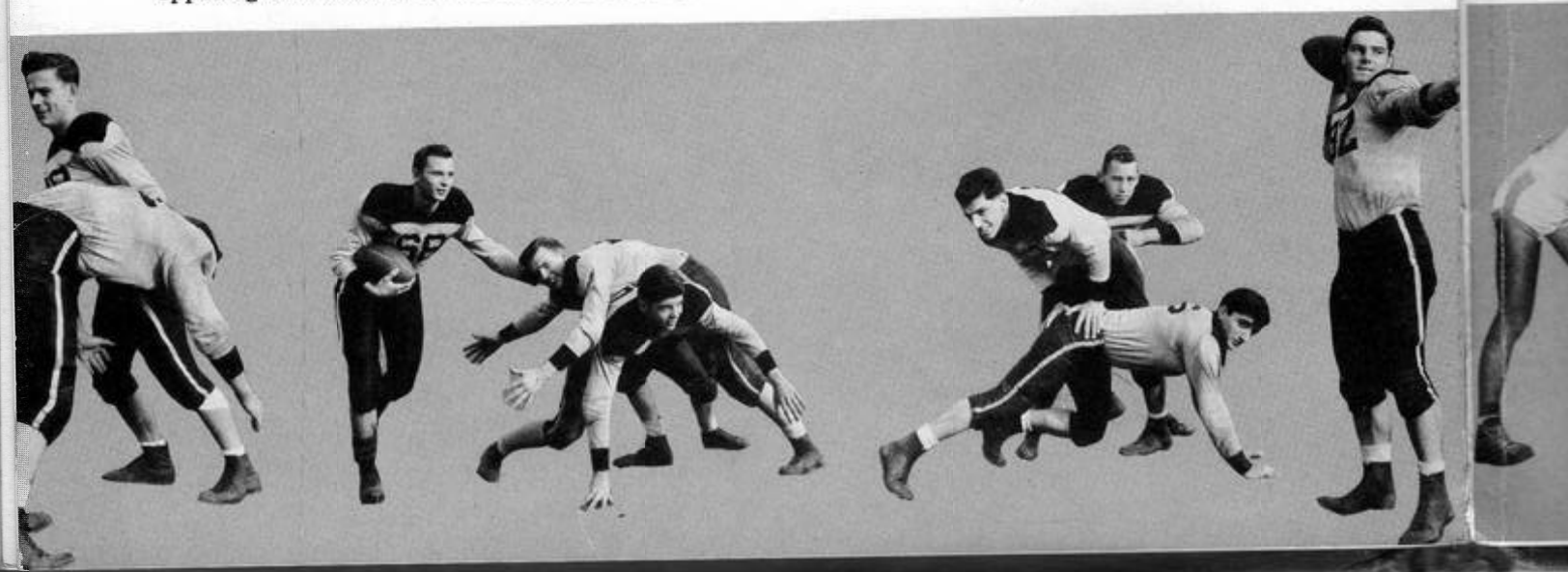

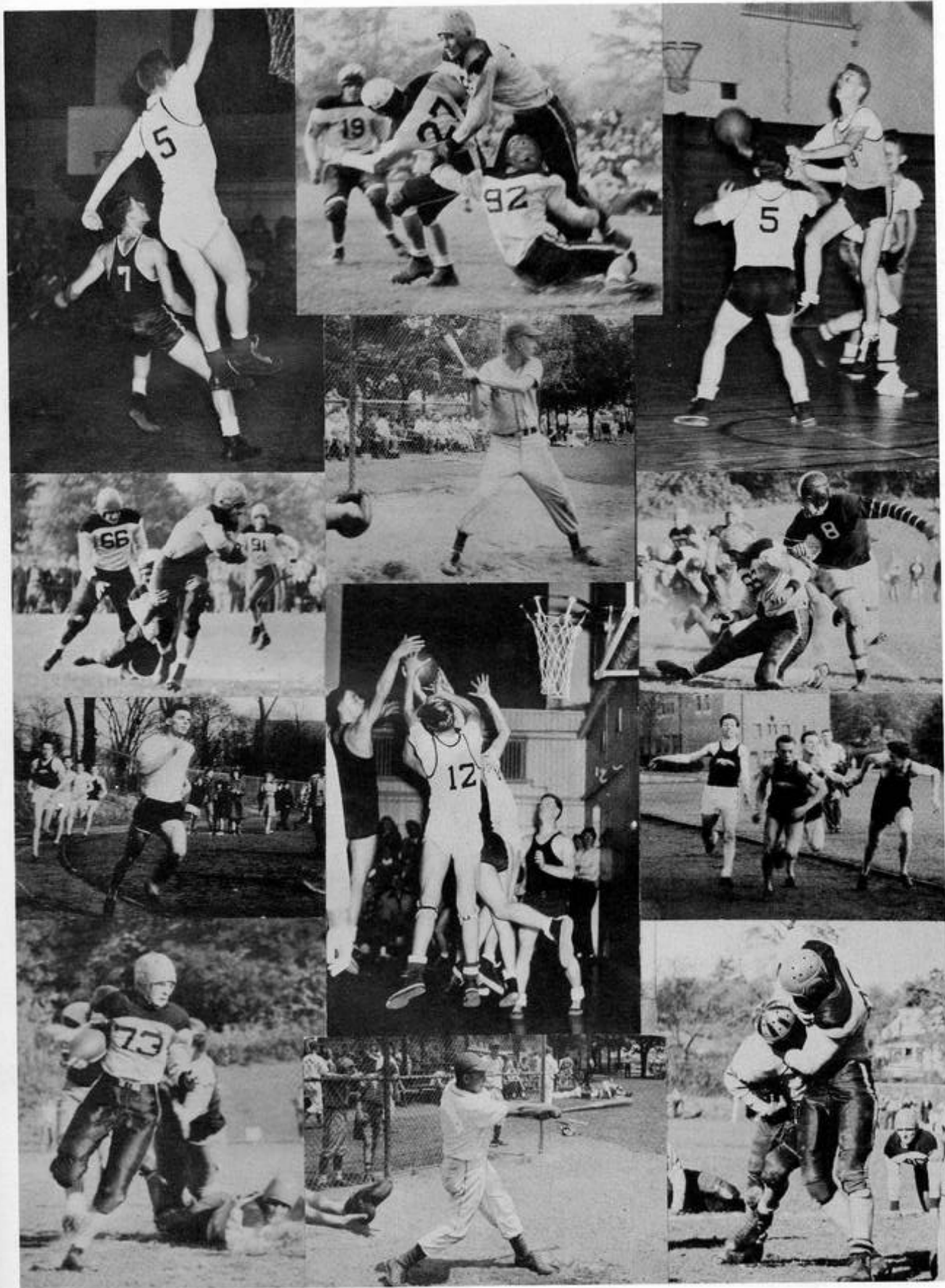
