the Panthers were threatening on the Irvington four yard line.

At Bronxville the story was different. The East End squad upset the Broncos 13-7 after a scoreless first half. In this game the Panthers showed a great deal of stamina and spirit. The next week the team tried to make it two upsets by beating Harrison, but the "Huskies" rolled over the Panthers 20-0.

Once more the Bellows outfit came back after defeat and edged out Darien 20-19 after the Connecticut team had a twelve point lead. This was a thrilling contest, the last quarter being played in the dark because of the delay in starting.

In the last game of the season, the Panthers lost to Rye, a result that stretched the Garnet winning streak to fourteen years.

Although the Bellows squad did not always come out on top, we can be proud of the team for its sportsmanship and team spirit.

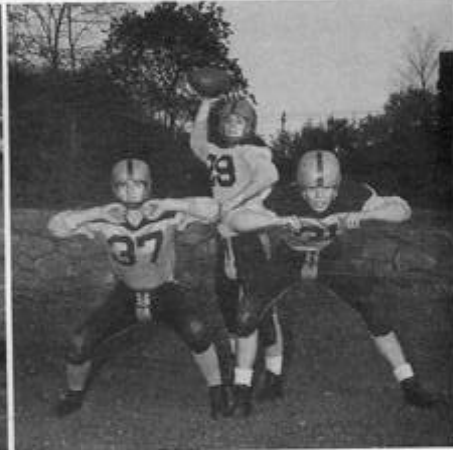

BASKETBALL

S.W.I.A.C. champions again, this time undisputed. With only three veterans returning from last year's championship club, Coach "Jack" Hasley molded another outstanding team. This year's record was an impressive thirteen wins against four defeats.

After dropping the opener to Stepinac 69-61, the Panthers sprang back to win the next three games, including the S.W.I.A.C. curtain raiser against Rye. Following the Rye contest our first and only League defeat fell at the hands of Harrison. Stepinac again beat us in a thrilling battle 64-61, but from there the Hasleymen ran up a fine eight-game winning streak. Two of the most closely contested games were the second meetings with Harrison and Edison Tech. The Panthers avenged their Harrison setback with a 56-51 triumph. A strong Edison Tech quintet

was also in the close running for the S.W.I.A.C. crown, but after a see-saw battle the Panthers ended on the victorious side of a 45-40 count.

Captain Ed Petrie led the Bellows quintet with his all-around excellence in both defensive and offensive play. "Pistol Pete," as the press sometimes entitled him, cracked the Bellows individual scoring mark for one game by tallying an incredible 51 points against Pleasantville in the final S.W.I.A.C. encounter. His 456 total for the season also surpasses all records for Bellows.

The Panthers now go out to defend the class C and the C-D open county championships that were won by the 1950 squad.

Five Seniors graduate from the ranks of this year's team but leave capable underclassmen to defend the S.W.I.A.C. crown which they helped to obtain.

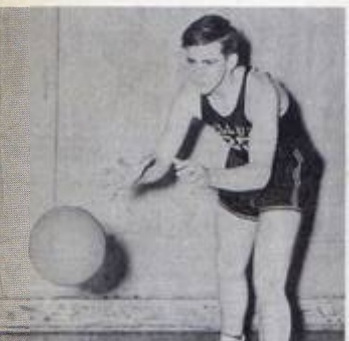

TRACK

The 1950 track squad of Bellows High School under the direction of Mr. Fred Wurzbacher was the greatest in the history of Bellows. Its achievement was proof of the wisdom of Mr. Wurzbacher's training policy, for he had concentrated on these men as Freshmen and Sophomores until the result was a finely molded team. The squad continued to go on undefeated in dual meets, extending the victories to fourteen straight in three seasons. It also won the S.W.I.A.C. and Section I Class C meets for the second straight year. The East Enders traveled to Arlington to capture the Arlington Invitation.

The season started off in a dual meet at Rye, where Wurzbacher's crew defeated the Garnets 56-39. Blessed Sacrament was next to fall in defeat to the Panthers, when the Bellows thin-clads trounced the Cards by 72-23.

The following Saturday the squad joined in the District I Class B relays. Entered in three out of the five relays, it won all three. Captain Ed Kayner in the shot put took second place behind Durham Lawshe, while Bob McDonald grabbed a second in the broad-jump, and Donald Anderson took a third.

After a short rest from the relays the Panthers went up to Harrison and trounced the Huskies. In this meet Wurzbacher's ace sprinter, Bob Keegan, lowered the B.H.S. 220 record by two tenths of a second.

The next meet was the Rye Invitation, probably the biggest Invitation meet in Westchester, where all the schools run in the same class. Bob Keegan was the star of this meet, as he won the 100 yard and 220 yard dashes. Bellows took a second to New Ro-

chelle but beat strong teams such as White Plains, Pelham, Yonkers, and many others.

The B.H.S. cindermen relaxed in a dual meet with Saunders Trade as Coach Wurzbacher held much of his power and still won easily 56½-24½.

This brought the East Enders to the Arlington invitation. The Panther crew had no idea of what schools they were running against or the power of any of them, but they glided to a victory in the Class A and B section, beating North Tarrytown, and most of the other Hudson River schools. Bob Keegan highlighted this meet with an amazing 9.7 clocking in the 100 yard dash for a new school record.

In the next meet, the all-important S.W.I.A.C. at Rye, the Bellows stars not only retained their title but broke the record for the most points scored in a S.W.I.A.C. meet. Captain Ed Kayner broke the shot and discus records. Keegan also was a double winner in the sprints.

The B.H.S. cinder champs went to White Plains to retain the Section Class C title. In this meet the East Enders broke the scoring record which they had set in the previous year. Ed Kayner, Bob Keegan, Ed Van Pelt and Gene Giancola, who raised the school pole vault record to 11'6", qualified for the West Point meet.

In this meet Keegan set a B.H.S. and State record in the 200 which he ran in 21.4. Ed Van Pelt lowered his own State half-mile record to 1:57.7. Ed Kayner won the discus but was just short of a record.

Coach Wurzbacher deserves much of the credit for his excellent coaching and his attitude in shaping up the greatest B.H.S. track team to date.

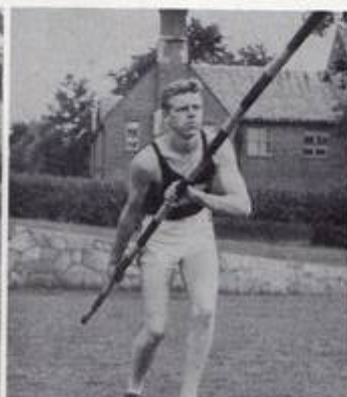

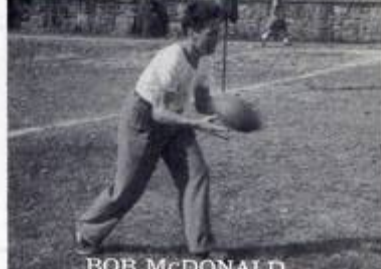
