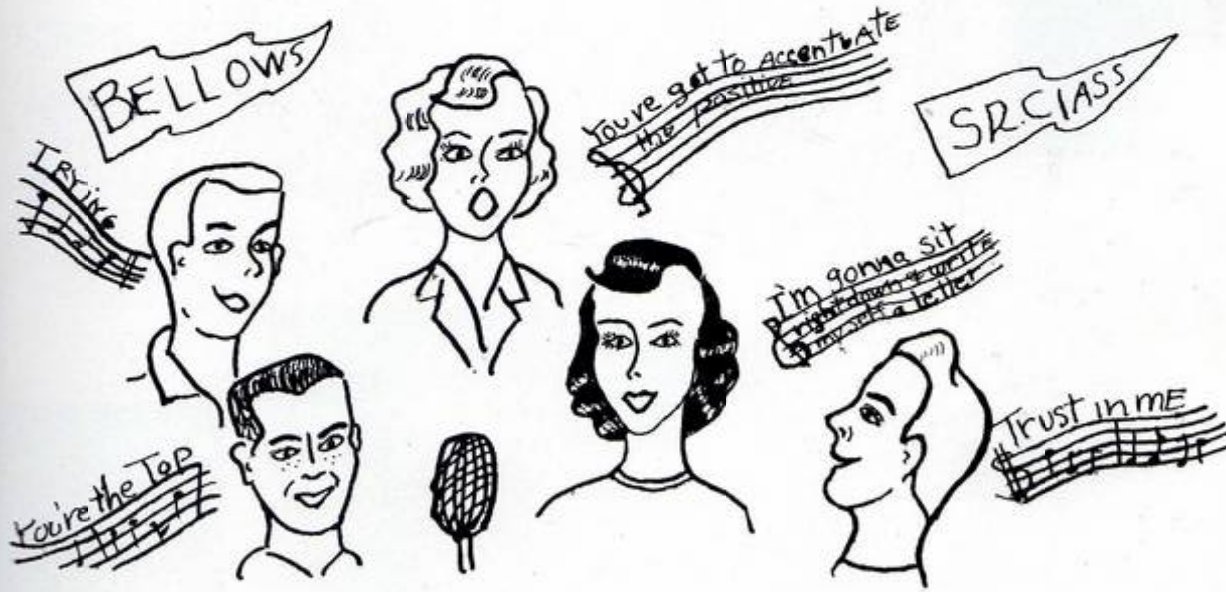

FOOTBALL

Six wins out of seven, three "Daily News" All-Westchester choices, one All-County first team man and two All-County second string players. That was the Bellows '52 football record!

Chief among the reasons for this achievement was the excellent direction of coaches "Bill" Frye and Frank Torre. Not only did the hard work of these men count with the team, but also their enthusiasm aroused the spirit of the entire school.

Breaking tradition of the preceding six years, the team won its opening game with a rousing 25-13 victory over Bronxville. The 200 pound line played a tough defensive game, and touchdowns were tallied by Orsino, Faillace, Benson and Baird.

The Blue and Black inaugurated the home season with a tussle against a rough Elmsford team, this time whipping its opponents 20-6. The attack was led by the passing of Benson, although the defensive play by Spence and Lenotti proved outstanding. Touchdowns were made by Quadrini, Faillace and Benson with a safety added.

The Panthers, next meeting Horace Greeley of Chappaqua, ended a fourteen-game winning streak for the Greeley men. Lenotti's two touchdowns and fullback DiLorio's powerful bucks were largely responsible for a score of 12-0.

Back home, Bellows encountered its fourth unbeaten team, Tuckahoe, and added a fourth consecutive victory to its record. Lenotti again tallied twice, while Orsino's running rounded out effective offensive play by the backs. Tackle Quadrini scored as he picked up a fumble in Bellows' end zone, and DiLorio raced over for his first touchdown of the year. The score was 27-6.

Panther defense men Warren, Spence, Orsino and DeLitta starred in this game along with halfback Lenotti in a 69 yard jaunt. Touchdowns were made by Orsino, Benson and DeLitta, Bob sprinting 30 yards for his.

In a hard fought game with previously undefeated Blessed Sacrament of New Rochelle, the Panthers reached their peak. This sixth contest added a win by a tense 14-13 score. In the first quarter Lenotti provided a touchdown. The opposition responded with two of its own. Then came an 80 yard run to the Bellows' end zone by Benson, and bedlam broke loose as Hilpl kicked and broke the tie with the extra point.

Finally came the battle of the undefeated as Bellows met a strong, but not stronger, Rye eleven. Weather and luck for our team had both changed, however, and a drenched, shivering crowd watched a muddy pigskin foil all trick passes by which the Panthers had planned to wrap up a final victory. Touchdowns were made by Benson and Baird. The entire squad put up a grim battle, but the whistle blew with the score reading 26-19 in Rye's favor.

Deserved recognition came as the season closed with Benson, Faillace and Spence named on the "Daily News" Westchester All-Star Team, Faillace first string end on All-County Team and Benson and Spence quarterback and guard on second. Eight other squad members received honorable mention. The season may be summed up with the comment of the coaches, "It was team work all the way."

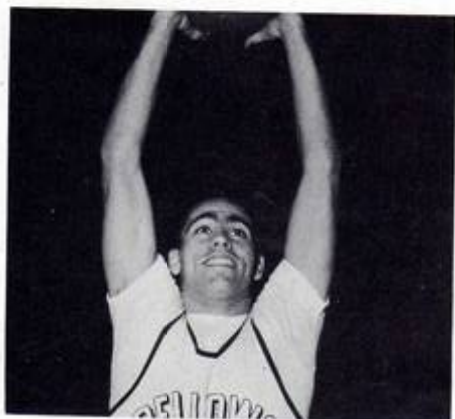

In the same week Bellows was again humbled as Rye overran the team 68-54 to take the SWIAC lead by one game.

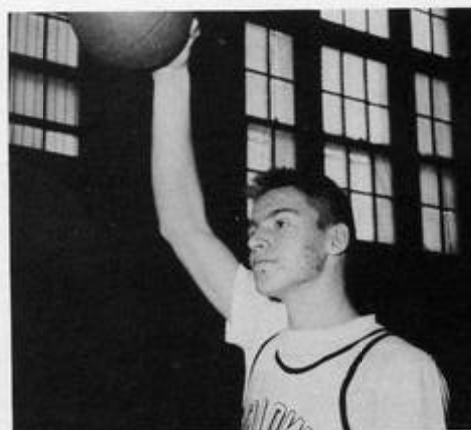

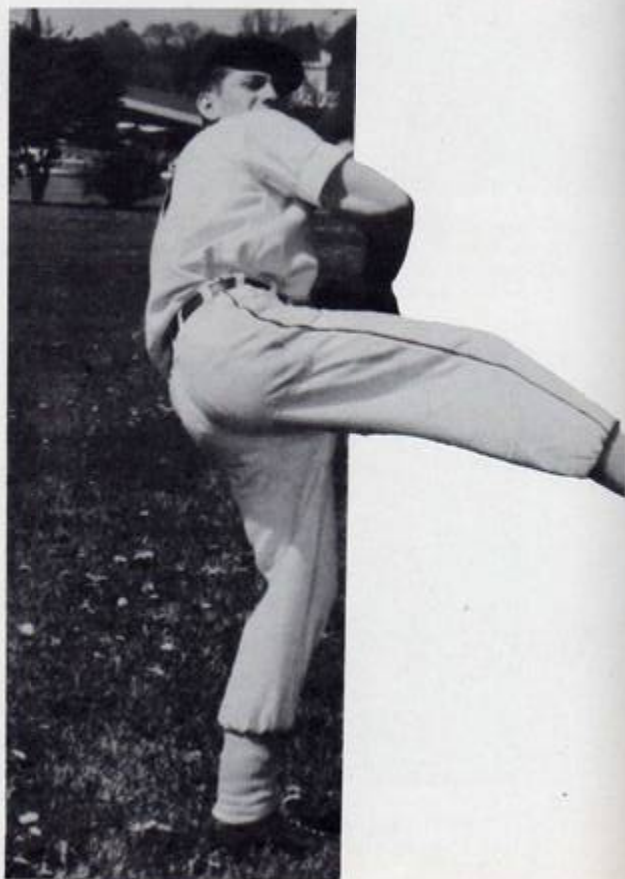

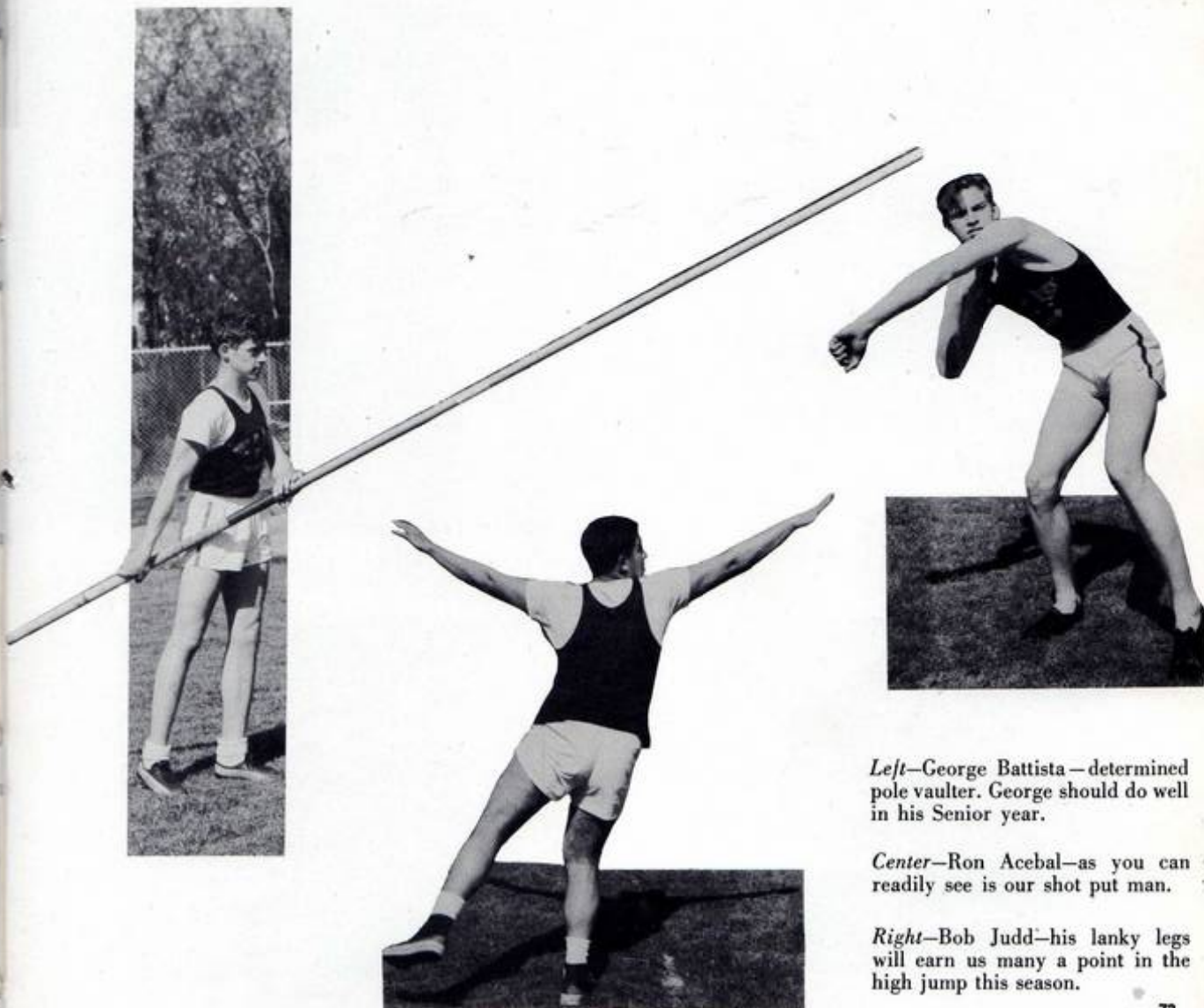
The meet with Horace Greeley proved a gloomy defeat for the Panthers, Bill Dunn in the discus event being the lone winner for Bellows.
