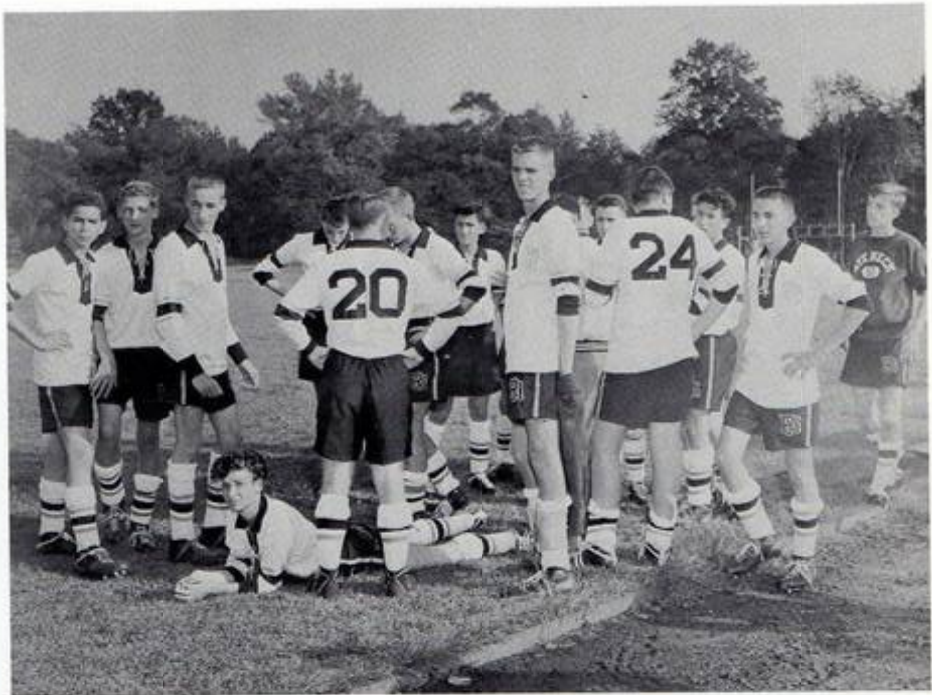

son, the team made a very strong showing for itself, compiling a record of 9 wins and 7 losses.

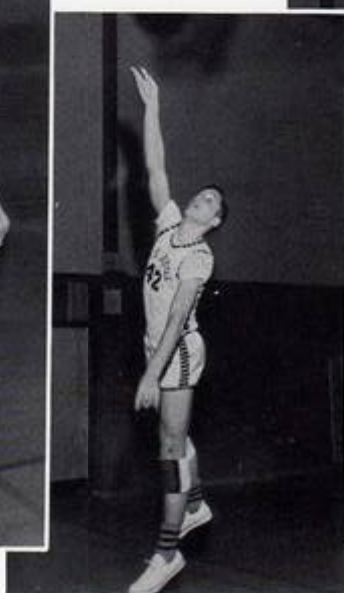

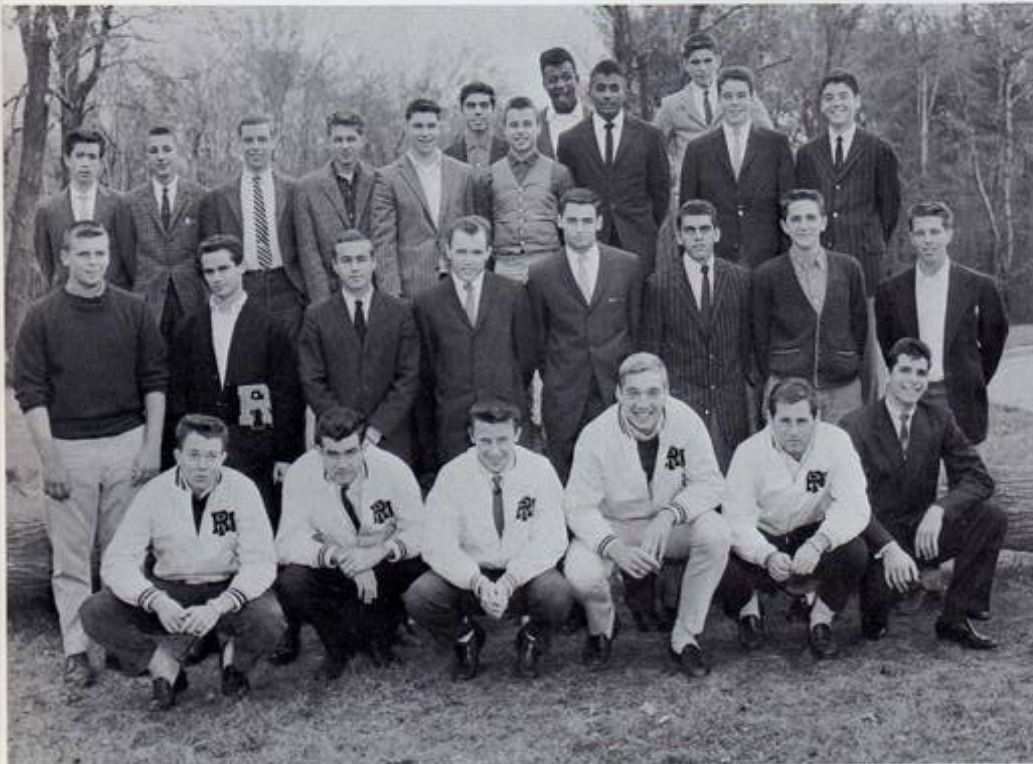
