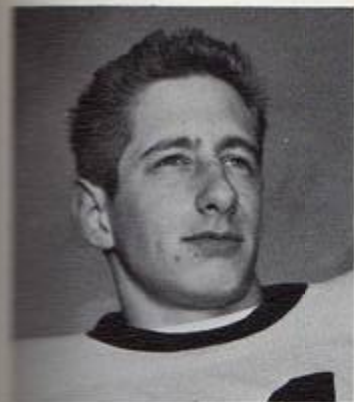

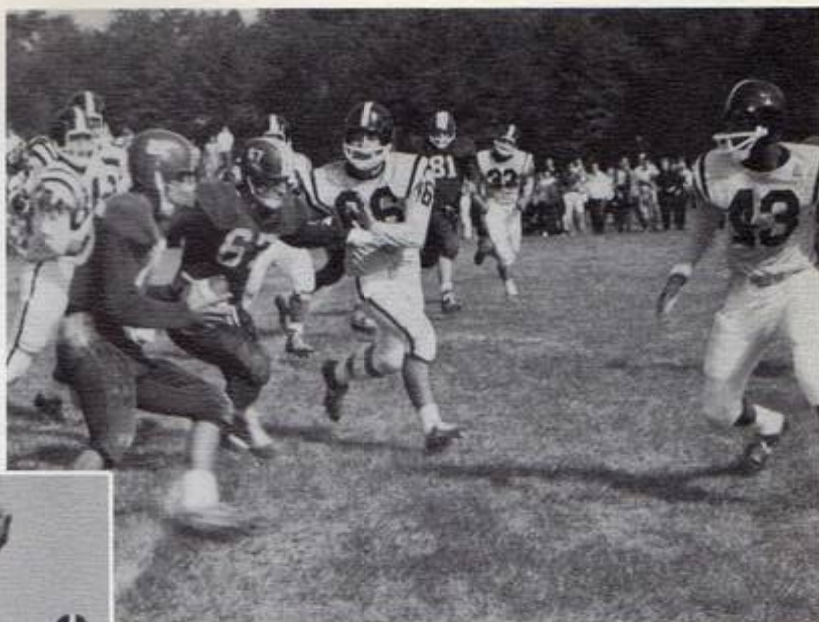

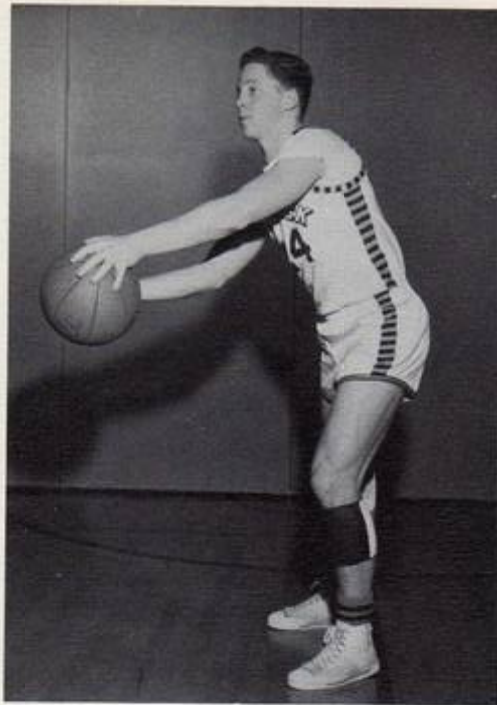

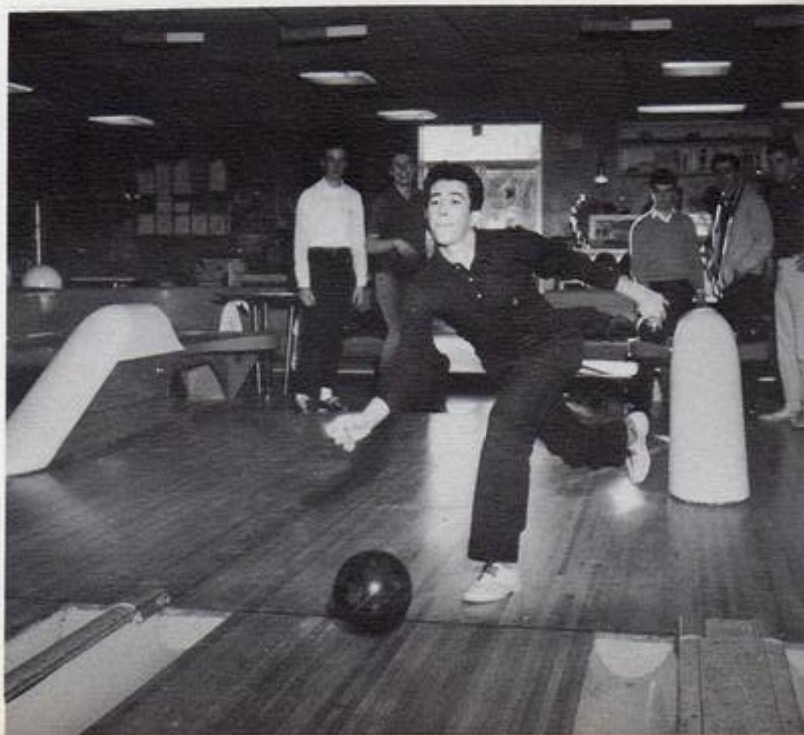
1962 BOWLING

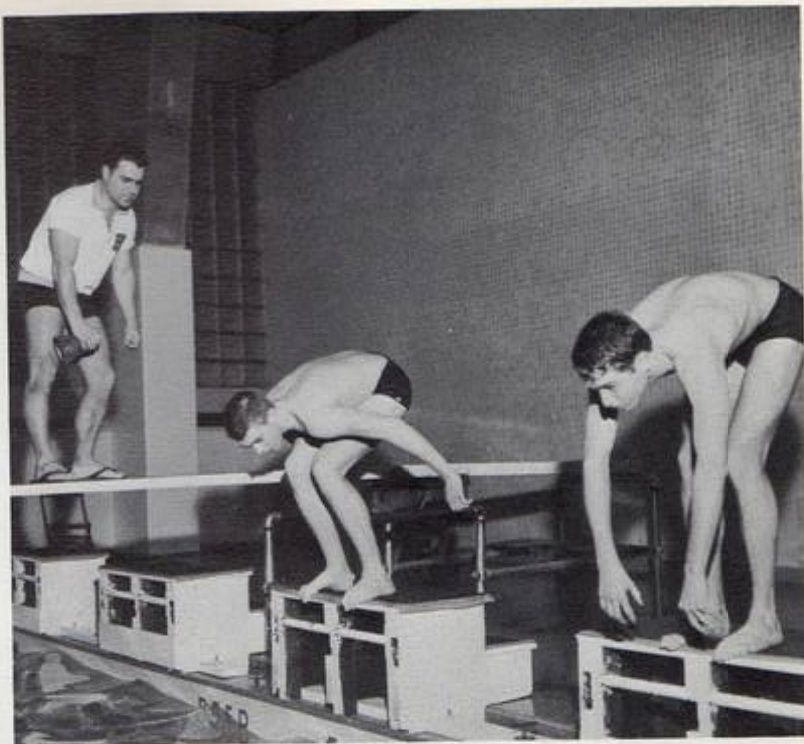

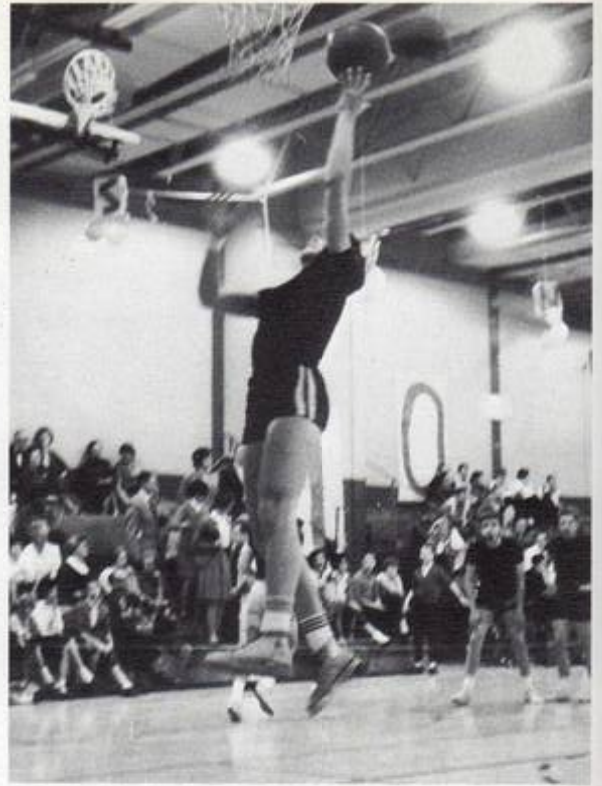
