New Trial In
N.Y. Fire 'Fix'**

NEW YORK (AP)—The conviction of John E. Gleason Jr., former City official found guilty of fixing a grand jury investigating a Fire Department extortion racket, was thrown out yesterday.

The Appellate Division of the State Supreme Court ordered a new trial on three of the counts on which Gleason was convicted. A fourth count was dismissed. Gleason, fifty-five-year-old former general inspector in the Department of Sanitation, had been sentenced to a 3½-to-7-year term after a Central Sessions court jury found him guilty on April 22, 1953.

He was indicted by a grand jury probing an extortion racket in which fuel oil equipment firms were shaken down in obtaining installation permits from the Fire Department.

James J. Moran, former First Deputy Fire Commissioner and one-time intimate of former Mayor William O'Dwyer, was sent to prison earlier in the kippen in the \$500,000 a year racket.

In questioning Gleason, the grand jury sought to learn who succeeded Moran as boss when Mrs. O'Dwyer's administration left office. Prosecution witnesses at Gleason's trial claimed he discussed the situation with them. Gleason denied it.
