



TALKING IT OVER

Some educators predict that sooner than you'd dare dream, ability rules restricting participation by some youths in intercollegiate athletics will pass out of the picture.

Physical education, they argue, is in the same bracket as a chess, chemistry, physics, English, Latin or chemistry—simply another subject.

Still further, this group of educators says the five don't require a boy to pass chemistry in order to take up the study of English, and so we need to pass algebra that he might attend a French class. Why is it he must pass a prescribed number of subjects to take physical education as exemplified in intercollegiate competition?

These educators agree that the development of a good citizen is the all-around purpose of the school and insist that athletes bear equal weight in this development.

"Citizenship Values in Athletics," by C. E. Boyette, Michigan director of high school athletics, excerpts of which I have used here from the "Journal," are an excellent "examination of citizenship lessons in athletics."

Mr. Boyette's article follows:

My reference, naturally, will be chiefly to the field of high school athletics. When a student opens in the fall the cell door out for candidates for their athletic team, not to a select few but to everyone who is interested and physically qualified. The coaching staff then makes the selection. It is not a matter of "who" but of "how."

There are many who would question the wisdom of this procedure which averages school athletes in terms of ability teams as not being a lesson in good citizenship. However, managers and spectators alike have a place in the democratic selection of winners. This procedure is not to be questioned by anyone.

We may further question the wisdom of the selection of athletes on the basis of ability. Does it not pay off in citizenship dividends? It seems to me that it does because there is no one else who can be so sure of "playing the game" as the athlete. He knows the rules and the possibilities of victory.
