

Mamaroneck Sextet Cops Fourth HL Victory, Beating Rye 3-1

Defensive Battle Broken Up By Two Quick Bent Goals

Rye High School's hockey team gave the Mamaroneck Tigers one of their toughest games of the season last night at Playland but finally bowed 3-1 to become the Orange and Black skaters' fourth victim of the season. The Garnet held the Tigers to a one goal lead in the first two periods and then knocked the count shortly after the final session started. The Benais, however, suddenly found their scoring ability and rammed two quick goals in to sew up the encounter.

Johnny Staropoli, Jolly Woodbridge and Frankie Burke, were the Bengal goal getters, with Woodbridge getting credit for an assist also. The Orange and Black center is fast becoming the hardest shooting player in the league and has tallied in every contest to date. It was his goal in the third session that sent the Tigers winning to the front.

Outstanding games were played by the Mamaroneck defense. SSI Pallace and Bruce Brackenhoff. The latter stole the goal stopping department hours by intercepting many Garnet passes that, if they were permitted to go through, would have meant all-out carnage. Pallace also performed admirably in back line. Warner Healy, although he didn't score, was definitely the most busy Tiger last night. He frequently snatched the disc away from Garnet skaters and set up plays that could have meant victory with some luck on the ensuing shoot.

The heavy action last night occurred in spurts with the locals having many chances to score. They were in Rye zone for a good portion of the first and third periods and practically set up home runs in the middle session.

Ed Tillman, whom Coach Bill Marts sent into the game as a replacement for Buddy Carter three weeks ago, showed a future. He was tough when he had to be and would have had his second shutout of the campaign but for a ridiculous goal by Rye in the third session. Tillman was adequate but didn't have too many chances with the Tigers' defense playing such fine hockey.

The puck went back and forth over the ice for the first five minutes of the opening period before the Bengals started a concentrated attack. It paid off shortly thereafter, at 7:36, when Coach Staropoli took a pass from Jolly Woodbridge and beat Rye goalie Ed Johnson from directly in front of the cage. This made it a 2-1 game but the Tigers insisted on another tally before their night's work was through. The second line was responsible for this one at 6:24 with Frankie Burke doing the honors. Leslie Covey Stewart had an opportunity to net the disc but Jolly Woodbridge had an opportunity to have Burke skate in and convert the rebound. Stewart took credit for an assist.
