Coal Supply Available To Fill Need

Dealers Report Town Had Enough To Meet All Distress Calls

SHIPMENT ARRIVES

Contrary to the Westchester County Health Department reports that there had been no coal in Mamaroneck for the past few days, local dealers reported this morning that there is a small supply coming in to the retail dealers and 25 one dollar piles of coal in the yards of the Colonial Coal Company near the railroad tracks.

A Colonial spokesman said today that the coal supply, retail dealers also reported receiving small shipments, some only a ton at a time, which they have reported to customers according to their best information.

Less than half a dozen calls which have been referred to police headquarters during the past few days have been received to the Health Department. Mayor R. P. S. Kelly said this morning that he received ten calls last week, but most of them were complaints about soft coal rather than distress calls from people who could not get coal at all. In a few cases he called the dealer himself, he said, and in other cases referred the caller to the Health Department one called back. "If the mayor said, 'I take it for granted they were all taken care of.'"

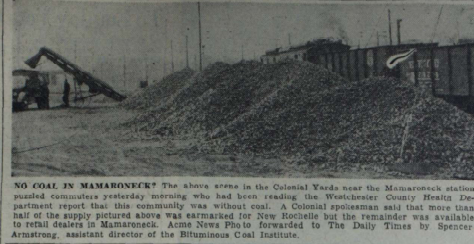

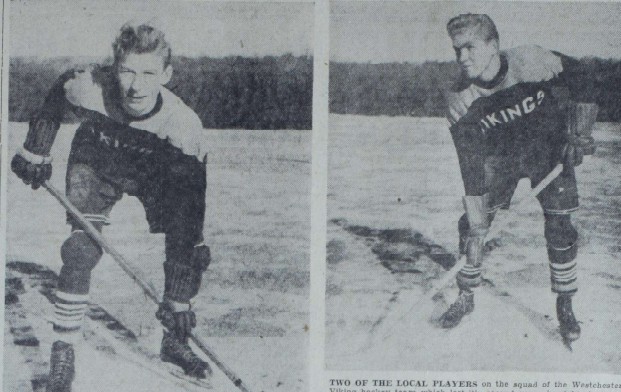

Six Meningitis Cases Listed

Since Jan. 2

WHITE PLAINS—An increase in spinal meningitis in the County Health District is reported by Dr. William A. Holla, county health commissioner.

Six cases have been reported since Jan. 2, two in White Plains, one of which developed Tuesday, only 37 cases were reported in the district during all of 1943.

The increase follows a trend noted in the armed forces, Dr. Holla said. The disease always increases in wartime, he said, and is spread to the civilian population by troop movements men home on furlough, and by carriers. The increase, however, is only partly due to contact with servicemen, Dr. Holla emphasized. Civilian carriers difficult to identify, are equally to blame, he said.

The acute stage has been used with good results in certain types of meningitis, Dr. Holla said. There are no special precautions which can be taken, Dr. Holla said, and the disease often strikes without warning. The increase has no relation to the flu epidemic, he said.

Nazis Won't Allow Slogans On Letters

WASHINGTON, (AP)—German authorities have advised the State Department they will confiscate mail for American soldiers if war-time slogans are pasted on envelopes.

To assure delivery of mail, Postmaster Walker said, such slogans as "V for Victory," "Win the War" and "Buy War Savings Bonds and Stamps," should be avoided.

Walker asked the public if mailing in a letter box, to place the letter inside a second envelope with this inscription: "Postmaster—Please use War Mail."

U. S. Light Guns Within Range Of Cisterna

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS ALGIERS (AP)—America beached troops, striking toward the Apennian Way and the main rail line to the Cassino front, have advanced to within light artillery range of Cisterna, a little over 14 miles northeast of Anzio, it was announced today.

The Germans launched heavy air attacks against shipping on the beachhead and again suffered badly at the hands of the Allied air forces which shot down about 14 planes over the area. Fourteen more planes were shot down during a heavy boom over the beachhead.

Violent fighting raged north of Cassino where American tanks and infantry beset out gains against fierce opposition and repulsed several counterattacks. Further north, French troops seized two hills north of Belvedere Mountain and the town there German counter thrust.
