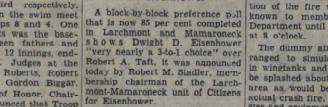
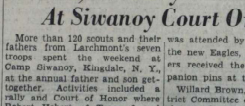

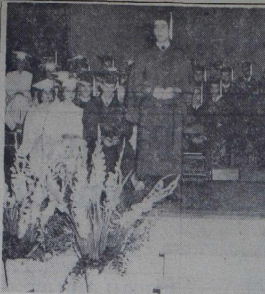

Fast Value Unheated Canned meats have the same food value as the meats from which they come. However, many of the canned meat products contain other foods so that the concentration of nutrients is less than the fresh form.

Let your imagination take over and dress up these meats for a party fare. They're really economical, and there's no waste or fuss in preparation.

Luncheon meats lend themselves to various treatments. For a quick supper some hot summer night, try out served broiled luncheon meat topped with pineapple, a summer green salad bowl, and hot French bread with herb butter. A fresh fruit bowl and cheese and crackers round out the meal.

To prepare the meat, slice it and cook each side with juice from the pineapple. Sprinkle with brown sugar, place the meat under the broiler until it's golden brown color. Just before the meat has browned, place a slice of pineapple on each piece.

For a cooler party main dish, you can serve hash loaf made from canned hash. Pop up the mixture with some minced onion, tomatoes, egg, and cracker crumbs. Add these ingredients to the hash, and pack in a loaf pan. Bake it for 45 minutes at 350 degrees F. This is good with a tomato sauce.

Rhee Gives Ultimatum

SEOUL, Korea (AP)—South Korea's political crisis heated a climax today as President Syngman Rhee handed the Assembly an ultimatum — adopt his proposed constitutional amendments quickly or he would dissolve the legislature.

"It will wait only a few more days," Mr. Rhee declared, then "I will take decisive action in compliance with the will of the people."

Mr. Rhee did not indicate how he would go about dissolving the Assembly. Korea's constitution makes no provision for such action.

### Senate's Money Group Faces Last Big Bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate Appropriations Committee today prepared to tackle its last big money bill for this session, a \$10 billion supplemental fund for foreign aid, military construction, atomic energy and other programs.

The House approved the measure Saturday after administration foes latched off \$309 million in two days of heated debate. The approved total was \$3.7 billion below President Truman's original request.

Congress hopes to adjourn Friday.

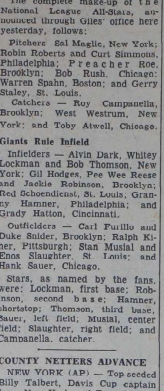

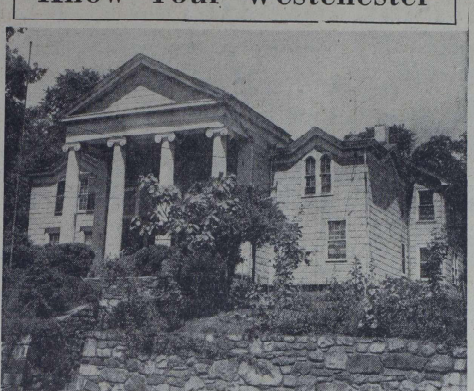
