FORTE SETS PACE IN TENTH VICTORY

Guard Registers 15 Points As Team Spurts After Slow First Quarter

Flood Conditions Threatened If Weather Prediction Holds True

Showdowns were at work last night and early this morning in the Village of Mamaroneck and Larchmont and the Town's unemployment section for this community showed a heavy March snowfall.

The U. S. Weather Bureau at 11 o'clock this morning forecast snow mixed with sleet and freezing rain this afternoon and tonight, and high snow tomorrow.

Temperatures will hold just below freezing tonight and there will be some thawing tomorrow, Monday is expected to be "fair and warmer," which will make the snow melt and the roads will be icy but may create flood conditions.

The precipitation was measured at Mamaroneck at 1.1 inches last night and at 11:30 at 1.3 inches at Larchmont, the Western Joint Water Works, in Mamaroneck.

In mid-morning there was a light rain and the wind increased. The rain did not get into the streets and the weather bureau said at that hour that sleet or freezing rain would continue into the evening.

Main bus lines were kept open by constant plowing on through streets and highways and trains ran on time with few exceptions. But the plows did not get into side streets and milk and bakery deliveries were delayed. Hundreds walked to the station and to work last night for the first time since the heavy snow last night.

Pioneers working the night shift had a slippery surface on the pavement. A head-on automobile collision on New Mill River Parkway sent a man and woman to hospital.

The temperature stayed around 30 degrees with the change to heavy snow. Bitter cold will make snow removal more difficult. But a crisis will prevent further drifting which might tie up traffic.

Drifts already were two and three feet deep in some places and the amount of snow strewn all over the place across roads and drive ways.
