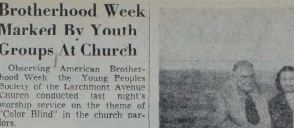

State Income Tax Reduction Of 40% Given

ALBANY, (AP) — Governor Dewey today signed a bill permitting a 40 per cent "forgiveness" on personal state income taxes due next month on 1947 earnings.

He also signed a measure fixing the tax at 3 per cent on net income of the unincorporated businesses based on 1947 returns.

For the past three years the income tax forgiveness has been 50 per cent, but 10 per cent has been in effect since the outbreak of the State Veterans' War.

Therefore, state income tax payments for 1947 will be 40 per cent of the full rate, or 20 per cent higher than last year's payments.

Fire Losses In Town Hit All-Time Low

Fire losses in the unincorporated area during 1947 amounted to only \$110,735, the lowest total in the history of the town of Mamaroneck.

The losses were reported by George E. Mills, Jr., said Wednesday night at the meeting of the Town Council in reading the annual report of Alford George W. Barto.

Fire losses for the previous year totaled \$92,100. Highest loss was \$34,000 in 1937, when the Chatsworth Gardens Apartments burned.

Members of the board joined Councilman Mills in praising the department for the exceptionally low fire loss in the 517 square mile area protected by the department, containing buildings with an assessed valuation of \$2,674,000.

Finn Majority Hits Alliance With Russia

HELSINKI, FINLAND, (AP) — Two minority parties announced their opposition today to entering into a military alliance with Russia. Their stand means that parties representing a majority of the members of Parliament now are allied against such a tie.

The minority parties, the Conservatives and the Liberals, joined other parties and blocs, however, in opposing the opening of negotiations with the Soviet Union on a friendship and mutual assistance pact as suggested last week by Prime Minister Stalin.

The final decision on the answer to Russia now rests with President Juho Paasikivi, a statesman who with long experience in dealing with the Russians. Parliament would be required to ratify any treaty after his conclusion.
