mountain road.

his trail near the Mexican
border.

Britain's Labor
Facing New Test

LONDON, (AP) - Britain's Labor
government, victorious in two
crucial policy tests, mobilized its
slim majority of six seats in the
House of Commons today to beat
down a third Conservative attack
on Labor's spending policies.

By rounding up every available
Labor member, including some
from sick-beds, Prime Minister
Attlee's government last night
won a 23-vote majority against a
 Tory motion criticizing its housing
 record. The vote was 214 to 289.

The sentence was interpreted as
a harboring tactic to keep the
 Labor government under pressure
 to build up issues for the
 next election campaign.

The middle-road Liberals, who
lost their seats in Commons,
 were responsible for the slant
 in the government's majority
 vote last night. On the first
 week on steel industry na-
 tionalization, all the Liberals
 voted with the Conservatives
 to give Labor a 14-vote margin.

Last night six Liberals voted
with the government on the housing
 issue.

The BHS victory was the first half of the Section One events final program and it afterwards saw Bellows' take in championship of Westchester's only unblemished side, close a division winner New Rochelle in a clash which lacked polish and every thing.

Johnson vs Set Shots
The first half of the Millbrook-Bellows encounter was extremely exciting and close. The Panthers' role relied almost entirely on set shooting from far out and it is doubtful whether any county quintet has been better this year, or any other for that matter. Millbrook tallied four fouls and 10 field goals in that 16 minute stretch and seven of the two-point variety were collected on the high arch set.

The East Enders were having their troubles all through that session and it for an amazing demonstration of one-man balling by Steve Johnson, might have been better. It was Johnson who carried the burden under the boards and his rebounding was without fault. Steve generally considered the most improved player of all they ranked up 19 markers by halftime and then settled for a supporting role in the crushing assault that followed after intermission.

By showing your major you give him an option of proceeding with it or fleeing into the minor in which you know there is a fit.

club" but on perhaps only two or three cards, and that West therefore might leave the spade bid in without adequate support for the suit. So East at both tables bid 4-clubs. South reacted differently in that at the two tables, in one case doubling the contract and beating it a trick, in the other case leading 5-hearts and making it for a top.

West saw fit to bid 1. Spade instead of raising the club, the 4-heart bid by North did not present any difficult problem for East. He was able, without worry, to call 4-spades. South obviously could have gone on to 5-hearts, but feared that might be too high in view of his partner's pre-emptive jump. Furthermore, he thought his four trumps might result in setting the contract. So he passed, so did North and as a consequence West made the 4-spades for a clear-cut East-West top. West's club fit made his spade bid non-risky, and it paid rich dividends.
