Mischievous But Not Vicious

The report of County Children's Court Judge George W. Smyth for 1943 is reassuring. For there has been a general public opinion that the youngsters, because of wartime conditions and relaxed home control, were pretty much going to the dogs in a hurry. Now Judge Smyth tells us this is not the case at all. In fact, Westchester and adjacent areas, instead, should be proud of our boys and girls.

There has, it is admitted, been an increase in juvenile delinquency. There were last year 1,068 cases of such delinquencies as compared to only 600 in 1940, before the war. This figure fell off slightly to 806 in 1941, but jumped to 823 in 1942, and passed the thousand mark last year. But, insists Judge Smyth, there are few children who are as lawless and vicious as the picture which it might give. At least less dark than the figures indicate.

The child population of Westchester, according to the 1940 census, was 142,242. Allowing for a reasonable increase, this shows that the delinquents brought into Children's Court comprise only a little more than one-tenth of one per cent.

Secondly, points out the jurist, the chief issue is not in crime of violence, but in juvenile delinquency which may be mischievous and "ungovernable." We are quite sure that what has gone wrong in our language, but we are convinced from long experience that there are few children of any type of delinquency which are not subject to such outbreaks upon occasion. Certainly none of these three delinquencies anything to get you alarmed about.

On the other hand, the report of Judge Smyth shows that there has been no increase in the more blameworthy type of delinquency, unlawful entry, injury to persons and damage to property, when we compare 1943 to 1940. In fact, offenses for injury in crimes of violence and viciousness have been a marked increase.

Accordingly, let us give thanks to a Children's Court which handles such juvenile delinquencies factually, informally and yet impressively. And add some goodnight thoughts at the same time to such excellent juvenile delinquency organizations as the County Children's Court, the County Children's Association and the County Children's Club. Here in Judge Smyth's report is an excellent testimonial to the claim that Westchester's youth still remains decent and law-abiding.

June also brings up the Victory National Championship at Colonial Meyer, sponsored by George S. Meyer, editor of the New York Times sports editor by Saturday and will be postponed in full on Monday. Players may only book one tournament, but may play with one team and only those on the official roster may take part in games. One exception to this rule was made in the case of a science man who may play with any team, but may not compete in more than one outfit.

A unique rule adopted by the managers include:

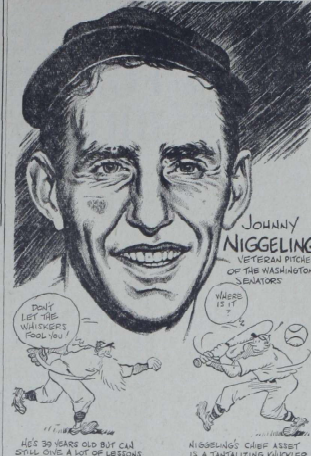
