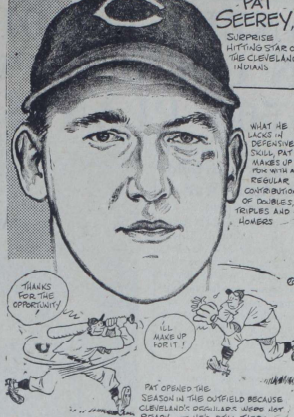

BARCLAY ON BRIDGE

LEARN BRIDGE FAST - Play With a Trump - There is just one basic difference between play of a hand at the No Trump contract and play at a suit or "trump" contract. In the latter one particular suit is called the "trump," and any card of that suit, no matter how little, will beat any card of any other suit, no matter how big. The fundamental law of always having to follow suit—play a card of the same suit as the card led to a trick—applies. But when you have no card of the suit led, then you may play anything you want. You may either "trump" the trick by putting a trump on it, or you may discard a card of some other suit. Take this example:

Suppose the bidding—and we will go into that in later lessons—has determined that South is the declarer with spades as trump. Let us go through the play which might occur on that hand.

West leads the heart K, the other three hands following suit, the winner of this trick is South. Again, and this time picks the heart C. South has no more hearts, "trumps" the trick by playing a trump on it, and so takes the trick. He then leads the spade A, and K, the other hands following suit. South leads the diamond 2.

West wins the heart K and leads the heart A. South trumps it with the diamond 2.

Except for the three heart tricks which were trumped and the three diamond tricks which were trumped—or "ruled," as one technical term describes this putting of a trump on the lead or another suit—the play was exactly the same as in the No Trump contract explained yesterday.

But what a difference the "rufting" made. A study of the four hands will show you that East and West had stronger hands than North and South could, so far as high cards are concerned, and yet North and South could take the first five tricks. DIG or DIET

By FRILLIE M. STOREY
HOW AND WHEN TO WATER

Growing plants contain an enormous amount of water in their composition. In some cases as much as 80 per cent, but the amount of actual water in the plants is small when compared with the vast quantity needed for rapid vigorous growth. To grow vegetables successfully, they should be grown rapidly and without check.

When you water we use a soil siphoner. It is a long narrow tube which we lay along or between the rows. One end is attached to the hose and the water seeps through the canvas, just where we want it. Our siphoner is 20 feet long so that we do not have to drag the hose into the garden at all, but can reach all parts from the side. It makes watering easier and is a great labor saver.

When you water, see on the side of too much water rather than too little. Great harm will be done your plants if you merely sprinkle the ground with water. The water will be drawn to the surface by the sun and the heat of the day and will burn them up for you. It is much better not to water at all than to water too little. You should water until the ground is thoroughly soaked to a depth of at least six inches. Most feeding roots go down about six inches and the water must be able to reach them. You can test how deep your water has soaked to by using a sharp pointed stick as a gauge.

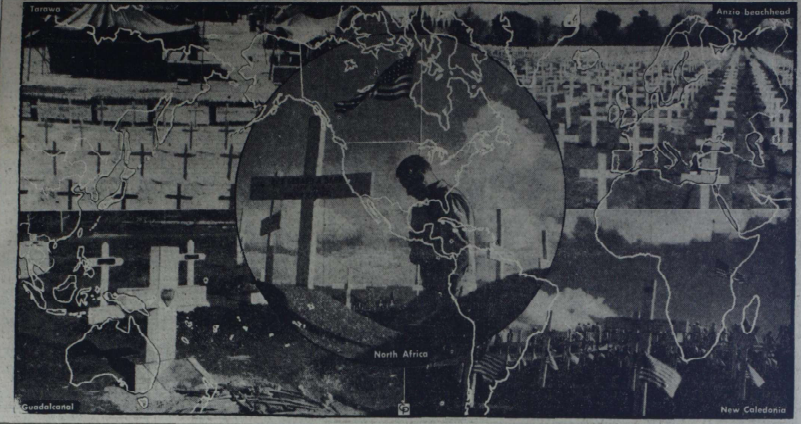
