Gaff and Gun Sports Group Studies Decline of Weakfish

With increasing attention being focused on salt-water angling the big question right now is... what has happened to weakfish? I have heard queries on the subject as far out as Sandusky, O. where I fished last week. From Long Island Sound to the Potomac, from Let's hope at the second. Between 1940 and 1947, the commercial yield of weakfish averaged 2 1/2 million pounds. It dropped to a little over a million pounds between 1948 and 1950. According to the New York State Conservation Department, commercial catches fell to a low of less than a half-million pounds in 1949. It seems superfluous to ask... is there something wrong? The figures indicate there most certainly is.

One organization, the Sportsmen's Council of New York's marine district, is most emphatically interested in the matter, and wants to know what does all the weakfish population. At the last meeting the organization made a start toward solving the mystery. On hand were Dr. William Sennig and Alfred Permuter, president of the New York State Conservation Department, Herman Perry, past president of the New York State Conservation Club, and Wayne Hildecker, secretary-treasurer of the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission.

Chinese Reported In Open Flight Before 'All-Out' Offensive

TOKYO, (AP)—United troops drove four miles inside North Korea today in what the United Nations ground commander called an "all-out offensive."

The 8th Pacific Air Force reported they fought Chinese on the U. S. 8th Army.

He showed he meant it by crossing into Red Korea himself, with a look and infantry tank force.
