GEARY WINS TOP SPOT IN POLICE LIEUTENANT LIST

Sergeant Scores 96.016 Per Cent in Civil Service Test

Sgt. Jeremiah Geary of the Manamorneck Village Police Department scored the highest mark in the Civil Service examination held in March for police lieutenant.

Denon Pransky, county director of Civil Service Personnel, disclosed yesterday, Sgt. Geary's mark was 96.016 including 2.5 points for veteran's credit.

Five other men also passed the examination giving Manamorneck a six-man lieutenant's list. It is expected that the Board of Trustees will choose a man from the highest three to be promoted to lieutenant.

Second to Sgt. Geary was Sgt. William Pogossy of the same grade with 89.04; then Sgt. Joseph Palmer of 208 Grand Street with 87.9; Patrolman Michael P. Clark of 107 Pine Knoll Lane with 85.36 and Patrolman Vincent J. O'Connell of 128 Prospect Avenue with 82.02.

Even without the use of his veteran's credit, Sgt. Geary placed high with 93.516 to which he can reserve the 2.5 points for later use if he wishes to do so.

When one of the sergeants is elevated to the lieutenant, the Board may advance one of three patrolmen now on the sergeant's list. Patrolman Clark is the first man on that list on the basis of an examination last year followed by Patrolman S. Charles Hahn and Patrolman Paul J. Hahn.

Louise Heister of 83 Harmon Drive, Manamorneck, is the only woman on the list for appointment as a lieutenant. She received a rating of 82.7 for the post which has a salary range of \$3,300 to \$4,110 plus \$25 in currency compensation.

U.S. Saturation Bombing Sorties Smash Huge Red Industrial Area SMOUL KOREA (AP) — United Nations warplanes smashed huge industrial complex southwest of Pyongyang today in the culmination of what the Air Force called the greatest saturation bombing attack of the Korean War.

The attack near the North Korean capital began at a yesterday morning and ended at 4 P. M. It was a "heavy" fighter-bomber sortie was down against the target.

Burned and blasted in the assault were a Communist hand grenade arsenal, the surface works of a coal mine, stockpiles of nearly a half-mile of machine shops and wire houses. They were along the north bank of the Pong-dong River between Pyongyang and its port city, Champoong.

It began with small arms fire by two Chinese platoons. Then the big shells fell.

Allied foot soldiers repulsed a grenade-tossing Chinese platoon in an advance U. N. position on the western front. Chinese were killed in the assault northwest of Chuvon.

As chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, Senator Connally said the Mutual Security measure is probably the last major legislation to pass through the Senate before he retires next January. He did not expect to run again.

The Texas Senator argued in a pointed Senate address against any further cuts in the authorization program, trimmed by his committee \$1 billion below President Truman's request. The House has approved a \$69 billion bill for foreign aid.

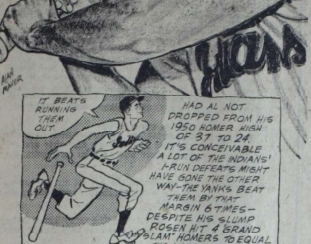
