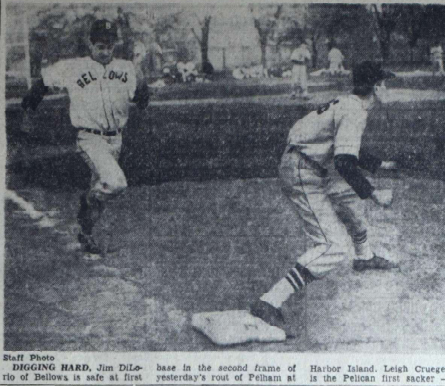

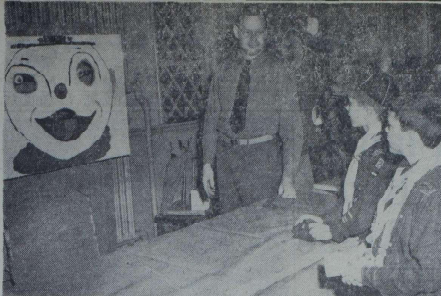

It added that Eniwetok will remain the headquarters and principal operating base for the Pacific Proving Grounds.

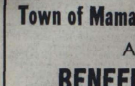

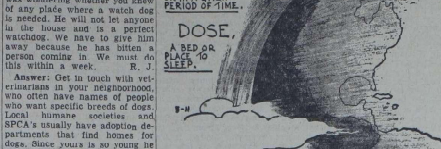
