concretely, what payments can a family head depend on under Survivor's Insurance? How does it work?

Let us take the case of Mr. Blank who died in a local auto accident about the beginning of the year. He left a 27-year-old wife and a two children, age 2 and 5, to fend for themselves.

Blank... we cannot reveal his true name... He had worked in a local plant since the beginning of his career. When his widow applied for payments we found that her husband had averaged \$200 per month during the ten years he had paid into the Fund. On this average monthly wage, we figured his widow's monthly payments at \$28.86. His children get these monthly payments every month until they reach age 18. If she works under social security, she loses her payments, but her children's continue. Blank at the rate of \$27.28 per month. By the time the youngest child is 18, will have received \$127,296. Then, if she does not re-marry, at the age of 65, she receives her \$28.86 per month for the rest of her life. In the average case this will mean an additional \$3,465.00, bringing the total payments to \$137,450.50. Contrast this amount of insurance payments with the money Blank paid in in deductions. In the 37 years he worked, he paid \$240 in deductions!

Now the \$67.30 per month that Mrs. Blank gets won't, of course, keep her particularly noteworthy. Blank's private insurance, plus the fact that he was able to move back into her mother's home, enables Mrs. Blank to get along. Even if she works later on, the children's benefits will be very helpful in supplying her with some income for the things that growing children need.

The monthly payments that Blank's widow, or any other widow is receiving under our present survivors program, do not meet their need. We in the SSA have recommended to Congress that the payment schedule be increased to enable us to fulfill the primary purpose of the Social Security Act — to provide the necessities of life for families who lose their breadwinner.

Dr. Amos E. Taylor In Pan American Union's New Unit

The Pan American Union today announced that it had secured the services of Dr. Amos E. Taylor to organize and direct its newly-created Department of Economic and Social Affairs. Dr. Taylor comes to the Union from the Department of Commerce, where for the past four years he has been Director of the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce. His new assignment is made possible by an exchange of letters between Secretary Harrison and Dr. Alberto Ultras, Director-General of the Union, whereby Dr. Taylor will also leave from his present duties as Director of the Commerce Department's Office of Business Economics to undertake the special task.

A distinguished economist of international renown, Dr. Taylor was born in Glenville, Pennsylvania on July 4, 1883. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Gettysburg College in 1915, his Master's degree from the University of Chicago in 1920, and his Doctor of Philosophy degree from the University of Pennsylvania in 1924. course in economics and international law at the University of Paris after military service in the American Expeditionary Force. Before entering government service, Dr. Taylor was Assistant Professor of Economics and Finance at the University of Pennsylvania and North-Western University.

Dr. Taylor's service with the Department of Commerce dates from 1930, when he became associated with the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce. He served as Assistant Chief, then Chief of the Finance Division (1931-39 and 1939-40) respectively; Chief of the International Economics Unit (1940-42); Chief of the Division of Research and Statistics (after December, 1942); and in August, 1943 was appointed Director of the Bureau. During his government career he has specialized in the field of international finance and economics and written extensively for economic and scientific journals. He is a member of the American Economic Association, the American Statistical Association, the Royal Economic Society, and the Académie des Sciences.

Dr. Taylor's new assignment marks the latest development in the internal reorganization of the Pan American Union. Under this plan, approved by the Governing Board on July 21, the Secretariat's twenty divisions are being re-shuffled into the following five major departments: (1) International Law and Organization; (2) Economic and Social Affairs; (3) Cultural Affairs; (4) Information; and (5) Administrative Services.

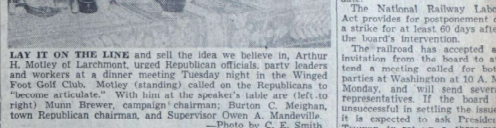
