

FOREIGN POLICY HANDLING SCORED

EN ROUTE WITH DEWEY. (AP)—Gov. Thomas E. Dewey charged today that the bi-partisan foreign policy has operated only when the Truman administration "has permitted it."

In his frankest public criticism of the President's handling of foreign affairs, the Republican Presidential nominee said that if he is elected in November he will carry out a "vigorous, competent and effective" drive for a bi-partisan peace policy.

In an address prepared for delivery in Louisville, Ky., at 1:45 P. M. Dewey assailed what he called the clumsiness, the weakness and the wobbling of the present administration in handling foreign affairs.

The New York Governor disputed any claim that may have existed that the personally committed—although he declined to say so publicly—President Truman's abandoned plan to send Chief Justice Fred M. Vinson to Moscow to negotiate with Premier Stalin.

He said the administration's lack of success in winning the peace in part had been due to its "failure to consult the Republicans before making sudden and vital policy commitments."

These have almost invariably got the country deeper into trouble," he added.

Although he conceded that "many of the obstacles we have run into were beyond the control of any American," Dewey said that since the United Nations conference in San Francisco two years ago cooperation "has operated whenever the administration has permitted it."

Dewey said that unless the Republicans had been given "cooperation" to the Democratic administration, we should have no strength in the present and future meetings of the United Nations.

He asserted that "Republican statesmanship" had "chaired" the administration's original project of a European Recovery Program into a practical measure providing that continued aid depends on self-help by the nations it serves," Dewey added.

Republican prodding has at last brought more aid to China. From Dewey for the first time came such words as "merciful," "helpless," "unwittingly confused," "mis-named Democrats," "misunderstanding" and "wobbling" in describing the President's conduct of affairs at home and abroad.

McGrath Sees Fight Ahead for Democrats

NEW YORK. (AP)—Democratic national chairman J. Howard McGrath says the Democrats face "a hard uphill fight" which the votes of women may decide.

"The Truman-Barkley ticket is gaining, however, the Rhode Island Senator declared. Addressing Democratic women workers yesterday, McGrath said:

"This election depends on the attitude the women take. From 1,000,000 to 1,500,000 more women will go to the polls in this election than men, and the decision may well rest in their hands, particularly for Senatorial, Congressional and state-level candidates."

Edward Knize, New York attorney representing Mrs. Mascari, served notice to the City that failure to settle the claim will bring on Supreme Court action.

Charging that the Germans are themselves have established a low ceiling upon us in order to win sympathy, Mr. Vandercreek said that "Americans are sending one million food parcels to Germany each week, but we have no state channels—more than to all the rest of the world put together."

Although there is "Precious little basic change in the Communist people," the speaker said that "it has come about that the largest single beneficiary of American Dollars is our late enemy—Germany. There is a far greater degree of dissatisfaction with our German policy in Europe than most of us are aware of. We do not find in Berlin so acute and nervous fear of war as we have here in New York."

Morgan J. Burke, Jr., president of the club presided over the meeting attended by about 200 members. Carl W. Schade, program chairman, introduced the speaker and the meeting was pronounced by the Rev. Francis J. Coffin, rector of St. John's Episcopal Church.

Wallace Will Stress Radio Talks in Drive

CHICAGO. (AP)—Progressive Party leaders demagogued Henry Wallace's personal appearances today. From now on his Presidential campaign will run more to radio talks, so that larger numbers can hear his voice.

On the radio last night Wallace slashed anew at President Truman. He said Mr. Truman "betrayed" Franklin D. Roosevelt's policies and "will live in history as the worst-defeated Democratic candidate who ever sought the Presidency."

JERUSALEM STRIKE DULLS HOLY DAYS

JERUSALEM. (AP)—Jews and Muslims will celebrate holy festivals with guns in hand in the religious center tonight.

For Jews the world over it is Yom Kippur, the day of atonement that ends 10 days of penitence at the beginning of the new year 5709 in the Jewish calendar.

For Muslims it is Id el Adha, that marks the end of the traditional pilgrimage to Kaaba in Mecca, tomb of Mohammed.

The two festivals coincide this year for the first time in decades. Because of the Arab-Jewish conflict, the festivals are more restrained and tense than in previous years.

The Jews are not allowed to approach the walling wall inside the old city because it is in Arab occupied territory.

Modern mosque will not be lighted as usual because of the shortage of electricity. Modern Jews, traditionally, featuring whole roast sheep, were dispensed with because of food shortages. The war in Palestine has reduced the number of pilgrims to Mecca to about 40,000, one third of the usual number.

TRUMAN BACKING NEW DEAL PLANKS

ABOARD TRUMAN TRAIN. (AP)—President Truman sought today to rally Mid-Western industrial voters behind his full-scale championship of the "New Deal" which he said Gov. Thomas E. Dewey hopes to "destroy."

Shifting his campaign strategy, Mr. Truman made his Republican rival for the Presidency the personal target of an increasing number of attacks as he swung into Indiana and Illinois on a heavy speaking schedule.

Not once did he call Governor Dewey by name, but at Willard, Ohio, yesterday, the President said that a single solitary man or woman in the United States has been able to find out where "the Republicans carried the standards" on the issues of the campaign.

And then, taking confidence of opinion surveys reporting Governor Dewey as leading the race, the President said of his opponent: "I think he is going to get a shock on the second of November. He is going to get the results of one big poll that counts—this is the voice of the American people speaking at the ballot box."

Mr. Truman makes another major speech tonight at 10 o'clock on farm policy in the armory at Springfield, Ill., after placing a wreath on Lincoln's tomb and riding in a torchlight parade.

Jack Kroil, director of the CIO Political Action Committee, campaigning with the President, told the same crowd only two Republicans ever cared about the people's welfare, he said, his opponent was Teddy Roosevelt and they threw him out of the party. The other was Abraham Lincoln—and he was shot by a "Dixiecrat."

As for the President, he proposed an eight-point program to build "a better way of life" on the foundation of the "New Deal." It embraced renewal of the "Fair-Deal" Act, increasing the minimum wage, extending social security to new groups with a 50 per cent increase in benefits, action "at once" on high prices and other proposals rejected by Congress.

Columbia Installing Gen. Eisenhower Today. NEW YORK. (AP)—Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower, president of Columbia University since June 7, will be formally installed this afternoon.

National and world leaders in education, government, industry and the professions will attend the installation of the 194-year-old university's 12th president.

Steads of 300 American colleges and universities, 38 foreign universities and 37 learned societies, as well as representatives of a number of educational foundations are expected to attend.

The installation will be the first of its kind at Columbia since 1902, when the late Dr. Nicholas Murray Butler was installed as president.
