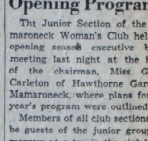

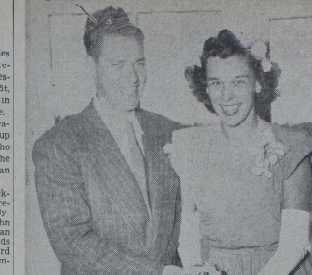

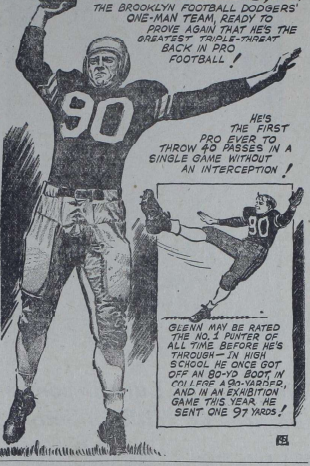

Citizens Selected To Back Dewey's Housing Program

NEW YORK, (AP)—Appointment of a state-wide citizens' committee of 1,000 to back approval of the electorate next November of three housing propositions sponsored by Gov. Dewey has been announced by Herman T. Stichman, State housing commissioner.

The propositions, already approved by the Legislature, call for: Creation of a new \$135,000,000 fund for slum clearance and public housing, to be added to the current \$300,000,000 fund. Increasing the maximum amount of State subsidize outstanding in any one year to help maintain state aided public housing at low cost levels. The increase would be from the present \$9,000,000 to \$13,000,000. Increasing from the present maximum of \$1,000,000 to \$1,500,000 the limit on public housing subsidies contracted for by the State in any one year.
