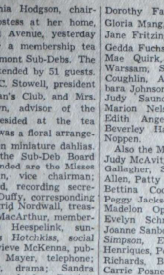

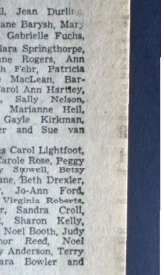

Rent Director Clarifies Law On Increases

WHITE PLAINS—Because of "considerable misunderstanding" which he said still exists concerning the Housing and Rent Act of 1947, Joseph F. Kelly, area rent director for Westchester, emphasized today that the act does not automatically increase rents...

"Many landlords and tenants have the mistaken idea that an oral agreement or the mere payment of an increase up to 15 per cent validates the increase," Mr. Kelly stated, adding that the lease must be effective after July 1 and must expire on or after Dec. 31.

"A copy of the lease, signed by landlord and tenant, and three copies of a registration form available at the Area Rent Office, 31 Mamaroneck Avenue, must be filed at the office within 15 days after the lease is executed, the rent director explained.

Stressing that the increase must be paid "voluntarily," Mr. Kelly said that the act does not require a landlord to accept a tenant's offer to pay more than the maximum legal rent before it is reported immediately to his office.


