

Bellows Cagers Streak Into Section One Tournament Finals

East Enders Maul Mt. Kisco, 81-39; Petric Cracks Record With Output Of 34 Markers

Confined to their den for more than a week, the Bellows Panthers were let loose last night at Peekskill and feasted on the Mt. Kisco Indians, 81-39 before a small crowd. This was the East Enders' initial effort in the division of the 1950 Section One Tournament and the locals' first sweep into the final six, just one thrust of their mighty scoring muscles.

In the other portion of the Class C semi-final round, Irvington staged an upset by ripping, 40-24, so the windup Friday night at the County Center will be the identical set-up of one year ago. The Livingston Bulldogs are the defending titlist and this year's king will be to battle the Class D champion on the Center floor Saturday evening.

Although the Blue and Black cagers, winner in 13 of 19 regular-season contests, enjoyed advantages in height and general all-around slickness, Kisco might have had a chance to outpace the tourney if Ed Petric hadn't chosen this opportunity to let off steam. The jet-propelled scorer, whose exploits have won him out of our state universities, found the basket 13 times and rimmed eight fouls for the new BIS all-time scoring record. The 6-7 Petric didn't wear out any one of his repertoire of shots and the "bullet" name was in evidence for the barrage of goals that it soon was too late to remedy.

Coach Jack Haskins' course did need his other hoopers to provide the winning combination. George Fischer and Ed Foid were the chief aids with 14 total points with the blonde center and Steve Johnston doing most of the rebounding.

It didn't take long to establish that Bellows was far out of Kisco's class. The Haskinsmen grabbed the first rebound on a perfectly executed put play and were never in danger thereafter. The count rose to 25-7 after one quarter and Mt. Kisco was looking down the muzzle by 42-21 at half-time. The BIS men unloaded his bench in the second half but even the reserves were too much for a bedeviled herd of Indians who had actually been outplayed during the campaign. The East Enders edged a 34-point bulge at the three-quarter mark and a 42-10 o'clock show was in the air. It was the second year during the locals have administered this game and their hands were on a foreign court all year.

Petric dropped five straight markers at the County Center was good for 13 of his record total in the first half. From a 13-13 advantage the locals scored 19 tallies in a row and the flashy netter earned six of them. Kisco meanwhile could collect only five field goals during the whole first half and was literally blundered. A five-and-a-half-foot center named Lou Bellows, the only Indian who could cause
