Power Rationing Forecast In State

Continued shortage of electric power in New York State, threatening to hamper war efforts, will necessitate rationing electricity, according to a report by the State Power Authority, yesterday.

Questions to be asked in relation to the proposed amendment to the New York State Defense Act were discussed before the finance group round tables held in the White Plains YMCA. Massena, the speaker said, needs 150,000 additional kilowatts of power for its aluminum plant; it could get it from New York City, which now has available 470,000 kilowatts. So the power authority, cooperating with federal agencies, is planning high voltage transmission line to Massena and, if this is a long war, it will be essential to bring the low-voltage St. Lawrence power to the metropolitan area.

BERGER IS READY FOR GARDEN TILT

Bronx Welcomes Tilt With Canadian Lightweight
 He'll Encounter Robinson For Title Match

Five are the fighters in action today who have been seen by boxing fans that Maxie Berger, former Canadian lightweight and welterweight champion who opposes Tony Robinson, undefeated Briton in a 12-round match at Madison Square Garden tomorrow night.

Berger has had close to 100 fights as a professional performer in Canada and various parts of the United States. He has been an ace drawing card at all the clubs around New York and a few years ago boxed a total of 16 times as a main event at the New York Coliseum. Those 16 fights took him 10 months to complete and he attracted a total of 187,000 spectators for an average of better than 11,000 a show.

The strange part about this record is that Berger was thoroughly disliked by Coliseum fans—disliked Robinson who enters the ring with the winner that the customers wanted to see him get whipped. He had few soft touches, most of his opponents rating high in fight circles. But he kept defeating them, just the same and the fans tried to see him get whipped.

Many of the same fans who in the past protested for Berger's opponents in the Garden, came to see him today. He continued to give them good fights, they continued to cheer and he continued to win.

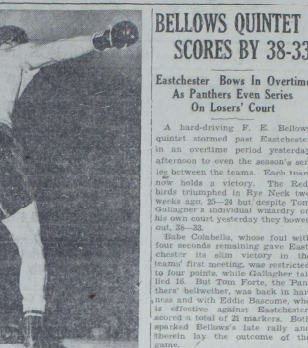

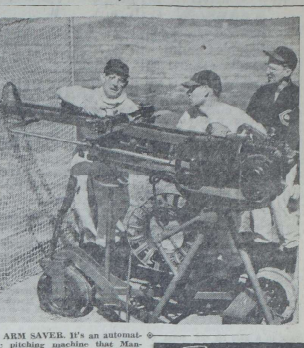

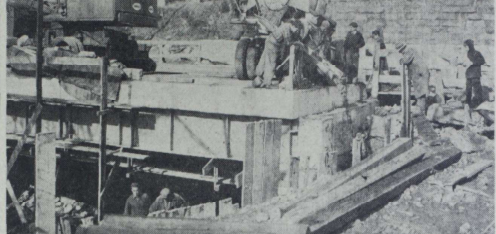

COUNTY AIRPORT PLANS ADVANCED

Supervisors Expected To Get Contract For Acquisition Of Site Monday

The contract between Westchester County and the Federal Government for site acquisition, construction and maintenance of a county airport at Rye Lake may go before the supervisors next Monday for approval, it was indicated today. Hervey F. Law, air port engineer for the Civil Aeronautics Administration, which will expend \$25,000,000 federal funds in construction of the airport, conferred on the contract with County Executive Herbert C. Gorchak at noon.

Mr. Law brought with him complete plans for the construction of the airport, showing runways and landing strips. The plans have already met with approval of Army Air Corps engineers and are expected to be satisfactory to the county. James C. Harding, county public works commissioner, who sat in a week ago at a conference at LaGuardia Field on the plans was at the meeting today with Mr. Law and Mr. Gorchak.

The county has, through the supervisors, approved an expenditure of \$275,000 for the land and this price may be cut to \$226,000 if the runways will permit acquisition of fewer acres. The acquisition must be made soon since the options expire on March 15. Should the supervisors on Monday put over the contract for a week, to permit study of the document, the options would probably be extended, said Mr. Gorchak.

Britain's Prime Minister Faces Likely Ouster Within Three Months

LONDON (AP)—An extremely reliable and well-informed political source, commenting on the failure of recent Cabinet changes to quiet public and parliamentary criticism of the government, said today, there was every likelihood that Sir Stafford Cripps would replace Winston Churchill as Britain's prime minister.

This source went so far as to predict that the doleful Churchill, whose speeches pulled Britain together in the bitter summer of 1940 and made him one of the most unseated within three months.

After bitter parliamentary debates, it must be emphasized, this source said, that while Churchill is vastly popular in the United States he has steadily lost the strength of his hold on the British masses since the fall of Crete last June.

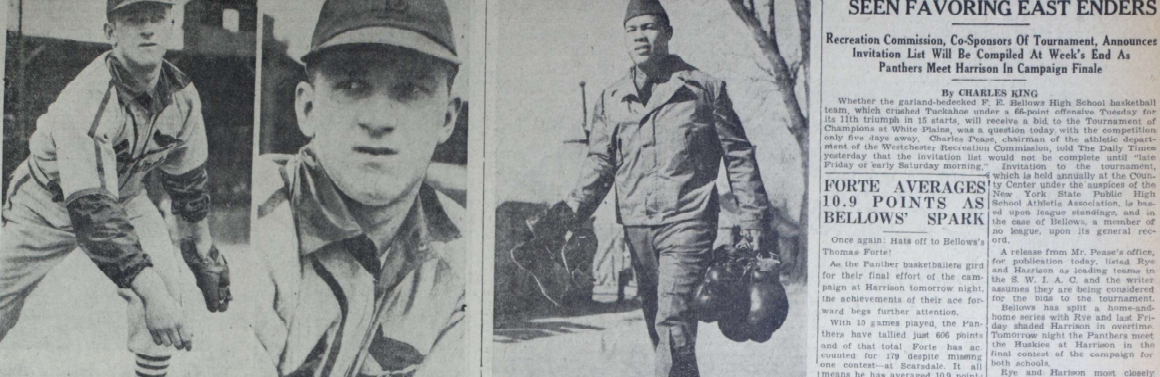
