CHINESE EXPAND RIVER CROSSING

AMERICAN GUNS UNABLE TO CHECK THREATENING BRIDGEHEAD TOKYO, (AP) - Chinese Red troops today expanded a Chinese Red bridgehead across the Chogyang River on the central Korean front despite the pouring of American guns.

AMERICANS AMBUSHED

ONE AMERICAN tank force ran into a Chinese ambush and pulled back after a desultory battle. The second ambush, which began when an armored American outfit ambushed Chinese patrols.

Red Movements Hidden

Bad weather screened their movements today. A P. correspondent George MacArthur reported the Chinese deepened their penetration below the Chogyang River despite a thundering American artillery barrage. There was little fighting between opposing infantrymen.
