CAUCASUS DANGER IS INCREASED BY NEW ADVANCE

LOSSES HEAVY

Germany's mechanized armies, fast closing an octopuslike strangulation on the Caucasus...

A second biphasic battle was in progress in the Kletkaya steppe, where the Russians said the upper and lower divisions of the German line were pinned aimed at Stalingrad.

The danger in the Caucasus is increasing hourly. The Germans drove new edges into Soviet lines at the mouth of the main trans-Caucasian railway linking the Black and Caspian Seas.

A bulletin from German staff headquarters reported that the Red Army's hurried back in two key sectors during bitter allied night fighting.

'Every day, reports near the front when the agreement signed between the German and the U. S. S. R. on the agency of establishing a second front in Europe will be put into effect.'

Simultaneously, a fresh flood of Nazi-inspired propaganda emphasized the alerted strength of German demands to combat a cross-section of 'imperialist profiteers of concrete and iron' extending from the English Channel coast.

On the Russian front, massive battles raged throughout the night, and at mid-day, the Soviet Communists acknowledged that Marshal Suvorov's triumphant armies had been forced to retreat in the Ilovaysk sector, 100 miles southeast of Moscow, and in a new zone at Rogny, 95 miles southwest of Stalingrad.

Masses of German tanks and infantry were reported attacking tonight and in the morning, to drive westward along a drive connecting the southern approaches to the Caucasus.

German also could strike toward the vital Caspian Sea port of Astrakhan, at the mouth of the Volga, 200 miles across comparatively flat terrain.

Yonkers and Eastchester have also accepted the plan and the society plans to select train and direct special "animal wardens" in first aid to animals. Dr. Shapers said.

The combined facilities of the veterinary medical societies in the County will house about 100 animals, he said, and if this space should be insufficient the society will call upon owners of private kennels and the humane organizations.

In an air raid, the plan calls for the utilization of professional services of the veterinarians; the hospital facilities and surgical instruments; the Central Message Center and evacuated animals and animal wardens, or women, properly trained to administer first aid to animals.

Dr. Shapers described the plan in detail as follows:

1. The air raid warden who is present at the scene, will be affected by the plan.
2. The person on duty at the Central Message Center will relay the message to the nearest first aid station to the village of emergency.
3. The person on duty at the First Aid Station will direct the animal wardens (who will be working in pairs) to go directly to the point of emergency.
4. The animal wardens will render help and first aid treatment as may be necessary.
5. Should the animal wardens decide that the services of a veterinarian is required or the use of a hospital, the animal warden will then phone the central message center and make his report.

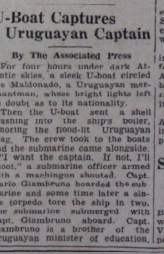

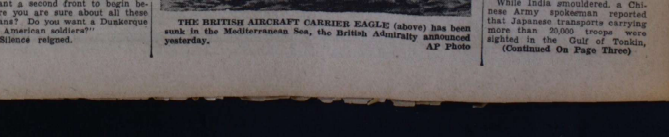

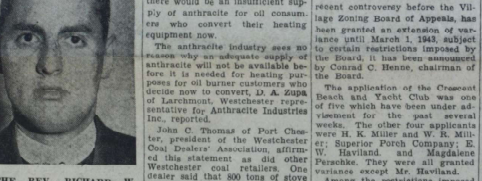

2,800 Enemy Dead Listed In Single Sector RAF IN RAID

By ROGER D. GREENE, Associated Press War Editor Russia's armies, fighting against a backdrop of their beloved 'City of Stalin' in flames, beat off German assaults above and below Stalingrad today and battled desperately to wipe out a deep wedge into the city's defenses in the center.

German dead littered the steps before Soviet trenches, dispatches from the Red Army command listed 2,800 Nazis, Rumanians and Italians killed in a single sector. German prisoners were described as hungry and almost exhausted.

"Northwest of Stalingrad, our troops repulsed several enemy tank attacks and counterattacks pressed the Germans back," said a midday bulletin from Red Army headquarters.

Nazi dive-bombers showered incendiary and high-explosive in the heart of the great Volga industrial city, setting many fires, while aerial torpedoes brought up reserves and parachute troops.

German field headquarters acknowledged that the Red Army were counter-attacking before Stalingrad and had broken into German defenses in the Kaluga sector, 100 miles southwest of Moscow.

2 Biggest Airfields Re-Captured From Japanese In North China

FIGHTING AT MILNE BAY Australians, U. S. Troops Battle For In Mud At New Guinea

CHUNGKING (AP)—The Chinese have launched a vigorous new offensive against the Japanese 40 miles north of Canton to match the attacks farther north which have brought capture of Chungking and Lanchow from the two biggest air fields in eastern China.

The offensive began Thursday along the Canton-Hankow Railway, the dispatch reported, with Chinese troops capturing a straggling 40 miles north of Japanese-occupied Canton, capturing the town of Paikien and driving the Japanese southward.

Several other points since have been taken in quick succession, including Katsungshan, Kweiweioung and Nanchangshan, the Chinese are still retreating, with the Japanese in hot pursuit, the agency said.

Meanwhile the Chinese in Chekiang province to the north retook their hold on the newly captured Chubien airfield from which United Nations planes may one day bomb Japan.

The Chinese High Command confirmed earlier press reports of the capture of Chubien, Lihai and surroundings points from the Japanese.

A communiqué said Chubien was retaken Friday at 4 A. M. Lihai at 4 A. M. after bitter street fighting, and Shichang, 20 miles northwest of Lanchow, at 4 P. M.

Six hundred Japanese were killed or wounded inside Lihai and 600 more in Shichang, the communiqué reported, while the invaders' position at Shungang in the area is "facing complete annihilation."

Chinese forces are completing mopping-up operations, it said. In this process, field dispatches reported the Chinese took Changshuan, five miles east of Chubien, Australian impetuous, aided by the small force of United States service troops, dashed through the mangrove swamps of southeast New Guinea today to combat Japanese seaborne invaders in heavy fighting on the shore of Milne Bay, 420 miles from Australia.

Gen. Douglas MacArthur's headquarters said the Australians were in close contact with the enemy forces and the fighting was growing in intensity.

United Nations spokesman said territorial gains which hampered the early phases of the land and air battle had ended, but troops still were fighting in heavy combat.
