FRENCH RETREAT SEEN FINISH OF INDOCHINA RULE

Final Chapter Is Expected Regardless Of Result Of Geneva Talks

By LARRY ALLEN Associated Press Staff Writer SINGAPORE—French withdrawal from the southern sectors of the Red River delta looks like the beginning of the end for that strategic area—and possibly for all of Indochina.

The delta, long regarded by the French and most Western powers as the main bastion against the sweep of communism along the rest of Indochina and southeast Asia, is crumbling in huge chunks.

The war against the Communist-led Viet Minh, now in its eighth year, may end with a cease-fire giving the rebels control of Indochina as their price, or they may take the area by smashing the French, in either event, it would be difficult to find anyone who believes that all of Indochina will remain in the hands of the French.

All Indochina observers—French, Viet and foreign—are convinced he will have all of Indochina in a very short time, regardless of any line drawn by the Geneva conference, since the final chapter is written in the delta.

The French High Command says the pull-out from the rich southern area of the delta was necessary to concentrate the defenses against an expected Communist assault along the Viet-Haiphong railroad and high-

An enclave 64 miles long between Hanoi and the port of Haiphong and less than 20 miles deep on each side of the road and all the land in between is being evacuated by French troops.

Most of the thousands of soldiers involved in the massive withdrawal are being taken up defense positions farther inland.

Mr. Mandeville also mentioned the plane that came in over the Rennie Brink golf links some time ago, pointing out that the pilot could have saved his own life by parachuting, but he had, instead, stayed with it until the time it might have been killed. "He, too," Mr. Mandeville added, "was a hero."

House Committee Hacks Defense, Military and Ship Programs

WASHINGTON (AP)—Singing out Civil Defense, military and hospital construction and ship-building programs as special targets, the House Appropriations Committee today slashed 39 percent from President Eisenhower's request for \$1,292,000,000 in emergency appropriations.

If sustained by the House, the committee's action will represent the largest percentage cut in 1954, and one of the largest in decades, in any Presidential budget. The House Appropriations Committee will consider the GOP-demanded cuts in the House early next week.

For the 16 federal programs involved in an omnibus supplemental appropriation bill—providing for the construction of 100,000 new units of housing, new and improved construction of 175,770,118 in amounts requested by the President. Actually, however, the overall cut was 39 percent, as it appeared on the surface.

This was particularly true in the case of military construction, for which the President requested only \$73,000,000. The committee recommended only \$47,000,000. The Defense Department should use unobligated balances of previously appropriated funds to help foot the construction bill, instead of seeking new cash and retaining the balances.

The Defense Department sought approval for 1954-55 funds to help foot the construction bill, in the amount of \$1,292,000,000. The committee recommended only \$823,000,000, a cut of \$469,000,000, plus \$300 million of unobligated balances. The Navy wanted \$140 million, but the committee recommended only \$73,517,000, with authority to dip into the 1953 fiscal year unobligated balances. RED SCIENTISTS NORTH OF ALASKA MAKING SURVEYS

MOSCOW (AP)—The Russians disclosed today they are maintaining "scientific stations" on two floating ice islands in the Arctic Ocean, north and northwest of Alaska.

The Soviet news agency Tass said teams on the ice floes are taking depth measurements of the Arctic Ocean, studying atmospheric conditions and making geological surveys of the island. The scientists were flown to their drifting bases last spring and are being supplied by helicopter.

Tass said one of the stations was located a few days ago at 88 degrees 22 minutes North latitude and 151 degrees, 40 minutes West longitude. This would put it north of Alaska and within 100 miles of the North Pole.

The other was pinpointed at 77 degrees, 22 minutes North latitude and 174 degrees, 20 minutes East longitude. This is above 500 miles and about 200 miles north-west of Port Barrow, Alaska. It is 450 miles from the pole.

The report said the Arctic islands are living in tents and put up fabricated houses heated with coal and gas. Fresh vegetables, leeks, peaches and strawberries are being flown to them regularly.

ARMY CLEARANCE 'OUT' MCCARTHY

WHEEL TO CARRY PLEA FOR AID TO NATION'S PEOPLE

Shunned in Capitol Talks, He Will Ask Help in 'Great Crusade'

WASHINGTON (AP) — South Korean President Syngman Rhee, deflected by official courtesy to his ideas in Washington, carried to the country this weekend his appeal for a "great crusade" against Communism in China. A statement jointly issued by Mr. Rhee and President Eisenhower last night made clear that the seventy-nine-year-old Korean leader had met with no encouragement during his talks here for his proposal for a militant campaign against Asia's Red rulers.

It was reported unofficially, however, that Mr. Rhee set Mr. Eisenhower's assurance of American aid to build up South Korea's military forces to meet the growing surges of Communist forces in North Korea. A diplomatic informant, asking not to be named, said the planned buildup to be discussed in further detail in a forthcoming staff talks continuing in Washington. Rhee would like the United States' reserve army force and giving her naval craft and jet planes.

By contrast, the joint statement of Mr. Rhee and Mr. Eisenhower was concerned mainly with cooperation and friendship and a pledge to "move forward," in accordance with the U. N. Charter, to achieve Korean unification.

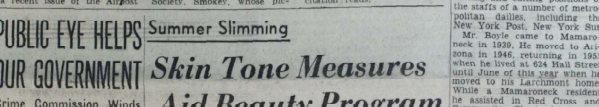
