The missing youngster, Joseph Bedner, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Bedner of 73 Cora Avenue, White Plains, was found on the parkway by a passing motorist, Sidney F. Brown, a used-car dealer, of 479 North Avenue, Bridgeport, Conn. Brown picked up the boy and brought him to Rochelle until he reached Patrolman Oscar Welling, New Rochelle policeman stationed at the school crossing on North Avenue, near the Scarsdale line. A search took the boy to headquarters, and White Plains Police were notified.

The State Police bloodhounds lost the trail of the boy, described as a runaway, at a baseball field in Mamaroneck early today, and the search continued throughout the county were alerted. The trail ended four miles from his home, near the Scarsdale line. A search of White Plains Police joined with Troopers and Scarsdale Police in the search last night, and all county police were working on the boy's trail today.

Police said the youngster ran away from one of his homes with his mother, Mrs. Christina Bedner, who reported her child was missing to White Plains police last night when he failed to return home.
