DON'T PLAY SOLITAIRE

POSSESSION of a part-score does not justify your becoming a solitaire player during the bidding, just because you see some way whereby you can make a sound bid which is high enough to produce a game for your side. If you succeed with the contract, the questionable factor in that series of hypotheses in the making of the contract you may bid. Maybe it can't be made. However, maybe some other game-theater contract can be, if you bid with proper consideration of the partner opposite you.

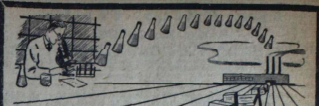
