Fresh Drive Seen To Turn Flanks Of Nazi Line

LONDON, (AP)—Reports of growing activity of Russian mobile columns on both ends of the long, rain-soaked eastern front suggested the possibility today that the Red Army forces were preparing a new drive in force to turn the flanks of the Germans in one or both of these widely separated sectors.

The central front on which the decisive battle is expected to be fought is the Dnieper River line from Kiev south to Dnepropetrovsk, remained quiet.

Despite almost unopposed roads and German counterattacks, the Red Army apparently was keeping the initiative in the sector east of the Volga. Yesterday Russian forces captured 40 towns and 150 villages in the Vitebsk sector to anchor their operations.

That single gain placed the advancing Russians within 100 miles of the Baltic coast in the Vitebsk area. The Russians were said to have captured a Soviet communications base in the city.

Kolchak, 30 miles east of Vitebsk, was the most important of the 45 towns liberated in the White Russian sector. Here the Germans launched several German counter drives, all of which were thrown back, according to the Russian communiques.

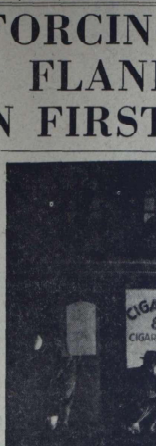
