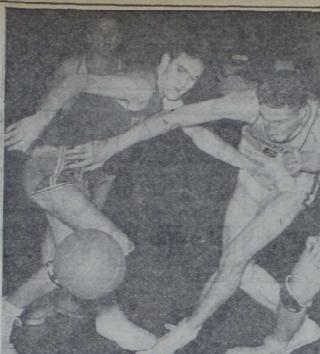

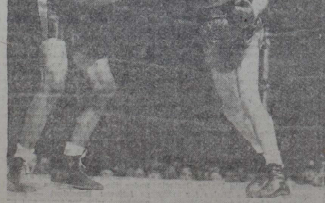

Dr. Driscoll Sees Adolescence As Complex, Transition Stage

Dr. Gertrude Driscoll, Department of Guidance, Columbia University, described adolescence as a transition period and said that "the very word, transition, indicates the complexities." Speaking Friday afternoon at Central School, before a discussion group, sponsored by the Mamaroneck Larchmont Parent-Teacher Council, Dr. Driscoll took the time to discuss "Stages of the Young Adolescent." The young adolescent, according to the speaker, is the child from 10 to 15 years of age. She noted that in many instances mental adolescence comes later than physical.

"During the period of rapid growth, the child's muscles do not respond readily to his impulses and his emotions are getting larger and larger," she said. "We must realize that they are uncertain and changeable, and that they need a great deal of help from adults—especially their parents. We need to find a substitute for an understanding adult."

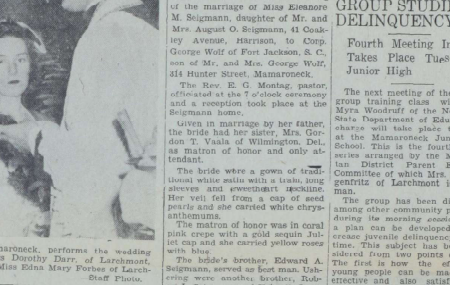
