Miss Clarke and Miss Howell have already begun to replace the herd of 20 low-producing cows with 30 high producing Holsteins. There is no poultry on the place at present but the two owners are now planning to raise it.

Miss Clarke expects to do the tractor work on the farm in addition to taking care of the children supervising the other work and taking the milk to the factory each morning in the farm truck.

Mr. Clark has a good deal of experience in the use of the tractor and he is looking forward to the assistance of his 17-year-old nephew after the close of school in June. He is an active 4-H club member in western New York. Until school is out, Miss Clarke will manage with whatever help is available at a price she can afford to pay.

Miss Clarke expects to have to solve this farm labor problem by using part-timers from state prisons who have been trained in farm work. They are in camp, often in good and is used extensively by many farmers who are short of help.

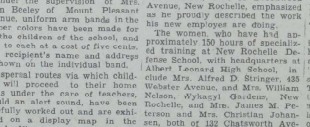
