We have lost count of the different styles and types of cotton garments that have been designed for war workers. They range from spark-proof caps to sandals with cotton straps.

- 1st—Buy at least three sets of everything you are going to wear.
- 2nd—Don't soak the lot out of them before they are washed—15 to 20 minutes are ample.
- 3rd—Be sure that they are rinsed thoroughly before they are hung on the line.
- 4th—Dry them in the sun unless the fabric are not sun-proof. Nothing makes a garment feel and smell fresh and clean as does a good sunning.
- 5th—Use a fairly hot iron and iron quickly. Avoid folds as much as possible and never iron the folds.

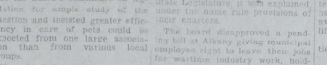

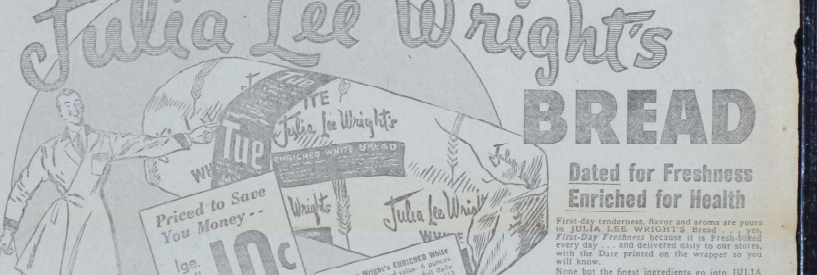

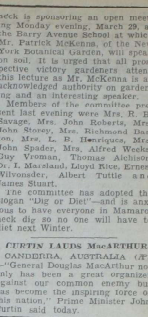

We even are reminded by Turkish Premier Saragoff's proposal that freeing of the Mediterranean might bring the Turks in on our side. If we need them, in any event, we do know that he who controls the Mediterranean was this war.

THE GERMAN says that Gen. Montgomery and his British 8th Army have opened the show in the South of France by capturing the coastal town of the powerful Marine Line of fortifications. It wouldn't be surprising to see him among the first to come into action for these defenses represent the major obstacle to be overcome.

POST WAR PLANS AT \$22,687,401

County Municipalities Submit Projects For Matched Money Program

ALBANY. Municipalities in Westchester have proposed for postwar construction in the state's "matched money" program to relieve anticipated unemployment projects totaling \$22,687,401, it was shown today in the interim report of the Postwar Public Works Planning Commission. The report shows further that plans have been already completed for \$1,470,543 worth of projects with \$2,840,000 in projects where plans are underway.

These figures are for municipalities only and do not include Westchester County's own proposals that the state construct, as a unit of the post-war program, the Palumbo-Fort Chester Parkway, or "New England Turnpike," as the state has named the proposed traffic link. This construction cost is set at approximately \$16,000,000 in addition to right-of-way which most

have acquired to supplement the \$6,000,000 county-ownable right-of-way in turnkey projects which will be to the state.

The municipal projects which are not reported in the state component are specified except as to cost, follows:

City of Mount Vernon, \$2,977,630; New Rochelle, \$3,308,800; Putnam, \$743,000; Rye, \$150,000; White Plains, \$2,066,000; Yonkers, \$5,967,400.

Town of Bedford, \$550,500; Eastchester, \$210,000; Greenburgh, \$75,000; Mamaroneck, \$250,500; New Castle, \$50,000; Larchmont, \$190,000; Somers, \$110,000.

Villages: Ardsley, \$11,977; Briarcliff Manor, \$385,000; Bronxville, \$200,000; Buchanan, \$85,000; Croton, \$146,000; Hastings, \$383,100; Irvington, \$69,000; Lawrenceville, \$120,000; Mount Kisco, \$243,840; North Tarrytown, \$139,000; Olaton, \$13,000; Putnam Manor, \$200,000; Pleasantville, \$384,000; Scarsdale, \$92,500; and Tarrytown, \$250,000.

Projects on which plans on designs financed by municipalities have been completed include:

Yonkers, \$259,000; Eastchester, \$235,000; New Castle, \$48,140; Ardsley, \$53,803; Briarcliff Manor, \$33,000; Croton, \$920,000; Larchmont, \$75,000; Larchmont, \$75,000; Putnam Manor, \$100,000; Pleasantville, \$3,000; and Scarsdale, \$27,000. It is understood that these projects do not necessarily represent the same jobs as contemplated in those proposed above.

Projects on which plans are now underway on designs financed by the municipalities are:

Rye, \$220,000; White Plains, \$1,114,000; Yonkers, \$1,253,500; Cortlandt, \$12,500; Dutchess, \$70,000; New Castle, \$152,000; Dutchess, \$75,000; Larchmont, \$32,000; Mamaroneck Village, \$250,000; Scarsdale, \$20,000; and Tarrytown, \$400,000.

On such plans as the state operates, it is the hope of the commission that the state will pay one-half the cost of drawing the engineering plans and, subsequently, the state will agree to pay one-half the cost of such construction, although neither commission has yet been voted by the Legislature.

6 Pillars of Peace Urged For America

NEW YORK.—A warning that the war may be greatly prolonged and "the outcome thrown in doubt" unless America decide immediately upon its future role in world affairs, was sounded today by John Foster Dulles, chairman of the Committee to Study the Basis of a Just and Durable Peace, when he outlined "six pillars of peace" that would commit America to a program of international collaboration.

He declared that the answer must be found now to the question: "With the American people now committed to a future of organized international collaboration within the areas of demilitarized 'interdependence,'" he said Mr. Dulles, "which our proposals are designed to force, and it must be made now or the opportunity for such collaboration will inevitably disappear and the world will be doomed to continuance of the war system."

The program would commit the United States to collaboration within six vital areas: (1) political organization between the United Nations and ultimately between all nations; (2) collaboration on economic and financial matters of

world-wide import; (3) international machinery to promote peaceful change as future conditions make necessary; (4) international organization to assure that the government of subject peoples is directed toward ultimate autonomy; (5) control of armaments; and (6) the right of peoples everywhere to intellectual and religious liberty.

Draft Deferment Measure Advanced

WASHINGTON, (AP)—Over War Department opposition the rules committee today cleared for House action legislation to give draft deference priorities to men with dependent and to post-draft quotas on a statewide instead of a local basis.

The committee's action was taken in executive session after Rep. Killaly D. Texas, author of the bill, contended there was no merit in the War Department's objections.

Secretary of War Simon had complained that the measure would create administrative impossibilities for the selective service system.
