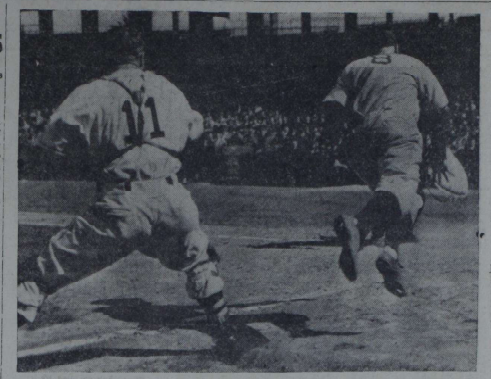

VANDERMEER IS STANDOUT HURLER IN MAJOR LEAGUES

Wins Second Game To Keep Reds Near Top Of National League; Yankees Triumph In 12 Innings As Dodgers Take Another Gift Game; Giants Lose Again

(By The Associated Press) Pitching has been the prize product of the major leagues this Spring, and outstanding performances have been piled on top of another. But there would be no argument if the question were asked, "who is the outstanding hurler to date?"

The answer is lefty John Vandermeer of the Cincinnati Reds. The New Jersey dutechman is slated for early induction into the armed forces and seems determined to gain his farewell to the National League in figures that will be remembered.

He has gone to the mound three times in eight days, pitched 29 innings and allowed only two runs and 12 hits. He beat Mort Cooper of the St. Louis Cardinals 4-0 in 11 innings on opening day and four days later pitched himself defeated 1-0 by Howie Pollock of the Cards.

2 Candidates State School Board Policy

In an election statement issued today, Edgar B. Ingraham and Willis M. Torbett, candidates for election to the Rye Neck School Board, summed up their policies and expressed the conviction that the administration of the schools should be "a community affair and not a political function."

The annual school meeting takes place tonight at 8 P. M. in the auditorium of the Bellows High School after which the budget will be voted on. Election of members of the School Board will be held tomorrow in the Bellows gymnasium. Hours of voting will be from 2 to 8 P. M. James Jackson and Benjamin Scherer are running for reelection to the board.

The complete statement issued by Mr. Torbett and Mr. Ingraham follows: "We accepted the candidacies only after feeling of a widespread feeling on the part of the residents of Rye Neck that there is a real opportunity for improvement in the management and direction of the school system."

"Summing up the main policies we will advocate, if elected first, the improvement of school work is especially trained in educational matters, should be given full authority and responsibility for the operation of the school system under general policies and directions of the School Board."

"Second, the increase in the Rye Neck School tax rate of 22.37, from \$8.88 in 1941 to \$11.25 in 1942, is extraordinary in comparison with the very small increase in other towns during the same period in neighboring towns. This calls for a detailed study and an endeavor to secure better results for less money. Taxes must be levied more during these difficult times."

"Third, the efficient administration of a local school system is a community affair and not a political function. Therefore the school Board should be made up of representative citizens who neither hold political office nor are active in any local political organization."

Gardens For Victory How To Use Supports For Peas, Tomatoes

EDITOR'S NOTE—This is another in a series of twice-a-week articles by the staff of the Rye Neck Victory Garden. The author of this article is J. H. Bode of the Rye Neck Extension Institute for Plant Research.

Adequate support is necessary for varieties of peas that grow to a height of more than two feet. The stems are very weak and easily broken and are able to assume an upright position only by means of the tendrils at the ends of the leaves clinging to a more rigid object. Twiggy branches of any kind but particularly birch branches, provide suitable support and should be placed along both sides of the trench at the ends of the pea plants after the pea plants are set above ground.

Any twigs falling out into the space between rows may be cut off with hedge shears as this not only gives a better appearance, but facilitates hoeing and picking the crop.

Chicken netting is another form of support popular where suitable brush is difficult to obtain, and while it is not as satisfactory as the stakes, it is better than no support at all. When netting is to be used, it should be placed in position before the peas are sown. After it has been attached to a suitable number of stakes a drill for the rows may be opened on each side of it. This is a much better method than to attempt to set it up after the peas are sown, as it is difficult to handle a roll of netting without injuring many of the pea plants.

Pea beans, as the name suggests, are usually provided with poles for support, but there are also equally well where peas are to be sown, however, they should be in position before the peas are sown. Stout poles are set up as they are used for supporting the peas. This is a much better method than to attempt to set it up after the peas are sown, as it is difficult to handle a roll of netting without injuring many of the pea plants.

When a sufficient number of poles cannot be readily obtained, pole beans may be grown in rows instead of hills. In this case poles are stretched from pole to pole the length of the row, at both top and bottom.

Huge Invasion Of Sardinia, Sicily Next

LONDON (AP)—The Vichy radio said today Allied movements reported simultaneously at Gibraltar and in Algerian waters may point to a large scale invasion attempt against Sicily and Sardinia island stepping stones from North Africa to the European mainland.

Germany's chief military commentators suggested in a broadcast that major Allied forces might push immediately on the two islands without waiting for the end of the campaign to drive the Axis out of Tunisia.

The German fear of landings on these islands has been berated by numerous broadcasts recently, said Capt. Ludwig Goerz, said last night.

"It is possible that the Allied High Command has refrained from throwing in the mass of its reserves on the Tunisian front because it is planning a large-scale landing operation. It may be planning a landing on the Sicily or Sardinia coast soon before the Tunisian campaign comes to an end."

The German commentator's forbidding forecast reported by the Nationalist station that a huge concentration of Allied shipping was being assembled at Gibraltar, including a number of landing barges.

Service units said the American Fifth Army being held in reserve in Algeria and Morocco under Lieut. Gen. Mark W. Clark was being trained as the nucleus of several Allied armies.

Lieut. Gen. Kurt Dietrich, German High Command radio commentator, acknowledged that southern Europe affords "particularly favorable conditions for landing" but declared the construction of fortifications by the Axis on the invasion route and "the nature of the country" would impede such operations.

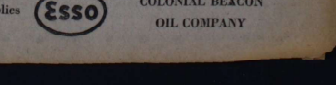

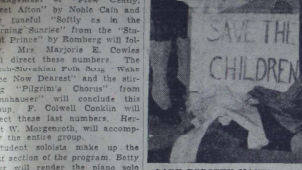

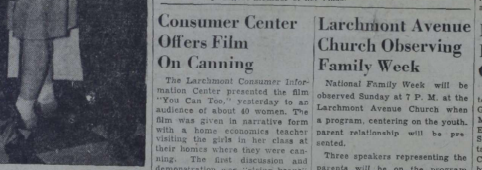
