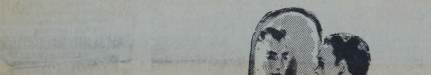

RUSSIANS BATTLE NAZI ONSLAUGHT

(Continued From Page One)

Sp anti-tank guns and seven batteries. The crisis in Russia's struggle on the central front was admitted by Red Star, Soviet Army newspaper, which said the Germans had driven salient into Red front lines by hurling great masses of reserves into an almost offensive. Soviet dispatches, however, declared that Russian counter-attacks had inflicted bloody losses on the Germans in at least two salients in the battle-scarred zone of Vyazma, 125 miles west of Moscow, and Bryansk, 220 miles southwest of Moscow.

On the southern (Ukraine) front Marshal Semenov Eudyevsky's armies counter-attacked from the Dnieper River Basin toward the Perekop Isthmus gateway to the Crimea were reported in danger of encirclement by the German drive to Mariupol.

Under a decree signed by Premier Mussolini, notes against the strike and sabotage in Italian-occupied territories were made punishable by death.

Hungarian press dispatches reported that the German paratrooper division after weeks of fighting had finally stamped out bands of forest guerrillas which had been harassing villages in German-occupied sections of Serbia.

One report said the expedition commander executed as many as 60 men at a time.

Red Star declared the German generals hope to decide the issue before winter begins, but said observers said the Germans appeared to have drawn forces from both flanks for the central push.

German planes struck at several points of Southwest England and South Wales overnight, and British communications acknowledged destruction and to a number of casualties, some of which continued blocked RAF raiding plans for the third night in succession.
