Adlai In Personal Attack

Not Tests But Peace Is Issue, Asserts the

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower said last night the compelling challenge before the world is not the matter of testing nuclear weapons, but of making impossible their use in nuclear war.

That, in a speech to a cheering crowd packed into City Hall's Madison Square Garden, did Mr. Eisenhower reply once again to Adlai E. Stevenson's proposal that the United States take the lead in seeking world agreement to end hydrogen bomb tests.

Mr. Stevenson, Democratic Presidential candidate, said beside his H-bomb proposal for the world, he said it is "a record of calumnious political perfidy" on his part.
