# Hudson, Markowitz named Rye Neck's top athletes

Humor and emotion were the order of the evening as the Rye Neck Rookies' Club sponsored its 22nd Annual Sports Awards Dinner at the Mulberry Street Restaurant Tuesday evening.

Along the way Rye Neck High's girls' athletic program received the lioness' share of acclaim upon completion of a sweep of major titles in the WCCC South League.

Football coach Dick Paladino supplied the affair's most notable humor. "I've just written a letter to the New York State Board of Regents," he stated, "asking that Gail Hudson be allowed to play tailback for our football team next year."

Boys football is probably the only sport Hudson didn't excel in this year, capturing her third All-County award last night (field hockey, basketball and softball) and being only the second junior selected as the RNHS Female Athlete of the Year. Hudson was touted Most Valuable Player in all three sports and led Westchester in field hockey scoring last season.

Her male counterpart was senior Dan Markowitz. A three-time All-League honoree (cross country, basketball, tennis), Markowitz was also chosen as the MVP in all three sports, sharing the hoop honor with John Colangelo.

The Boosters' Club offered a new award this year, a pair of Scholar-Athlete Awards, which were presented to seniors Kelly Haviland and Colangelo. "There is a 100 scholarship that goes with the awards," revealed Booster Club Co-President Richard Olcutti, "and we hope to not only make this an annual award but to increase the scholarship value in succeeding years."

Perhaps the evening's most emotional moments came as gymnastics and softball coach, Susan Vincent, bid farewell to both of her very successful teams. Taking a year's leave, Vincent will pursue a masters degree in the fall.
