Trolley Track MENACE TO CO

Village Reaches Agreement For Halstead Avenue Road Project

Old trolley tracks on Halstead Avenue from Mamaroneck to the Harrison Town line will be removed this Summer under a new agreement between the Village of Mamaroneck and the County Transportation Company.

The agreement, whereby the company would finance the removal of the tracks, should be reached and the project underway within the next few weeks.

Village Manager William H. Johnson has advised the Board of Trustees.

The company has rejected a proposal to remove the tracks from the town track. Approximately 800 feet of trolley tracks at the end of the road would be removed completely over the next two miles. Mr. Johnson reported.

On the other hand, to track the inside grove of the track and repair broken paving blocks was estimated to cost between \$500 and \$600, he said. Only the latter measure would be included under the company's contract with the Village.

The Board of Trustees had agreed that an attempt be made to remove the tracks covering the ends of the two tracks, removing as much as possible the objectionable "bump," Manager Johnson said.

Former Hitler Aide Talking And Writing PEACE HELD AIM

LONDON (AP)—Rudolf Hess is talking and writing "words which will make the German High Command sweat," the British Broadcasting Corporation declared today as it hit its stride in a propaganda campaign against Germany to capitalize on the flight of the No. 3 Nazi.

While the government-controlled BBC started on a schedule of 10 broadcasts a day to Germany on Monday, Hess' deputy and Prime Minister Churchill was declared to be writing and reading.

It was reported that Hess was preparing in some form or other to broadcast a message to the German High Command on the occasion of his flight.

Hess is said to be in the hands of the British, and it is believed that he will be held in a secret location where he will be writing and reading.

City, Town And Village Units Asked To Have All Members Fingerprinted

Because of "concrete evidence" that fifth columnists and foreign agents have been serving as members of local defense councils in this county, the County Defense Council will fingerprint all its members and ask that city, town and village defense councils do the same.

Announcement of the plan was made today by the County Defense Council which set Friday afternoon for fingerprinting its own members. A member of the County Defense Council will take the prints and send them to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Washington for filing with the FBI.

The County Defense Council will also send letters today to the city and village councils asking that they do the same for their own local members, and that the prints be filed with quarters which are to be distributed.

At the same time, the County Defense Council has sent a letter to each police and fire department, hospital and manufacturing firm, asking them to fingerprint all their employees.

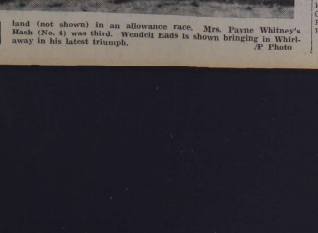

COUNTY TO MEET MID-YEAR DEBTS

Prompt Payment of Tax By Towns And Cities Makes Payments Possible

Westchester will be able to meet its mid-year fiscal commitments through prompt payment by towns and cities of the 50 per cent of the 1941 state and county taxes due on May 20, announced County Finance Commissioner Herbert C. Gerlach today.

Mr. Gerlach pointed out that as against the 60 per cent quota of the 1941 tax due, \$7,200,000 in advance has already been paid of \$6,618,902.

In addition, arrangements have been made by those which have not already paid the 60 per cent quota in full to send to the county treasury within the next few days a total of \$1,471,818.

With the \$4,802,295 cash on hand this will furnish the Finance Commissioner with around \$5,000,000 to meet immediate obligations, including debt service charges of bond amortization and interest on June 1 of \$4,605,746.

Total county contributions through May and June are \$3,521,511 and in addition to the \$3,500,000 on hand or expected within the next week, there will be state tax refunds, departmental savings and revenue from Playland.

Towns and cities which have paid in full their 60 per cent quo-

ta already, some having paid more than the 60 per cent and North Castle having paid the entire 100 per cent for 1941, are as follows: Bedford, Eastchester, Greenburgh, Lewisboro, Mamaroneck, Mount Vernon, New Castle, North Castle, North Salem, Ossining, Pelham, Putnamville, River, Scarborough, White Plains and Yorktown.

CASEY WELCOMES INQUIRY BY DIES

Files on Dozen Clubs And 14 Individuals Turned Over To Investigate

Sheriff George A. Casey said today that he will welcome a Dies Committee investigation of American activities in Westchester county that the people may know who belong to subversive groups and who supports them.

The sheriff's files, compiled for more than a year by Special Investigator Frank A. Capel, were subpoenaed Friday by an investigator for the Dies Committee and some of them were taken to the committee headquarters in the new Federal Courthouse in New York City where they are being studied.

One possibility is that a sub-committee of the House group will be delegated to go to White Plains and hold hearings to go through the voluminous evidence and gather more from witnesses.

The evidence turned over to the Dies investigators includes 14 individuals outside of group membership, consisting of letters, correspondence, photographs, confidential reports which were earlier given to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, postcards and other documents gathered by "undercover" operatives for the sheriff.

Sheriff Casey pointed out that he has been unable to make public his findings on subversive activity and that he has seen the power of subpoena to gather evidence and interview individuals.

The sheriff said in a statement, "Now that the Dies committee has subpoenaed my files, I will welcome a Dies Committee investigation of Westchester County in order that the people may know who belongs to these subversive groups and who supports them."

Existing arrangements are such that we are not privileged to make such disclosures. We have neither the power to subpoena witnesses, nor to hold hearings. These things the Dies Committee can do, and I hope that Chairman Dies will see that they are held in White Plains and expose to public view the subversive mind and activities in Westchester County.

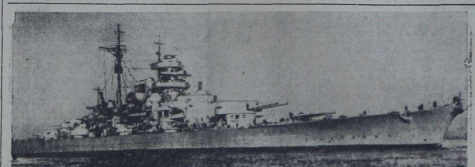

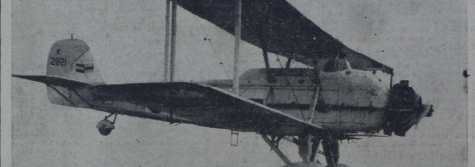

DEFENSE COSTS TOP 31 BILLION

More Than Half Of Funds To Be Spent In Stepping Up Plane Production

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Roosevelt's request to Congress for an additional \$2,000,000,000 for army and navy planes may boost cash defense expenditures beyond \$3,000,000,000 in this and the next fiscal year, informed legislators said today.

These figures said that probably more than half of the money he sought would be spent in stepping up plane production over the \$3,000,000,000 cash outlay level scheduled by the Office of Production Management for the period ending July 1, 1942.

The other half would go to pay orders already placed and for deliveries after that date.

Swiftly after Speaker Rayburn received Mr. Roosevelt's list of request yesterday, the House Military Appropriations Committee announced it would report hearings today on the War Department supply bill, already standing in recess of \$600,000,000.

Incorporation of the new request in this inclusion would greatly expedite congressional consideration.

Legislators said that the total to be paid out by the Treasury for defense equipment and materials actually delivered before July 1, 1942 without taking into account orders for subsequent deliveries, was likely to reach \$31,000,000,000 instead of the \$29,000,000,000 previously contemplated by the OPM.

COUNTY DEBT HITS NINE-YEAR LOW

Bonded Indebtedness Down To \$90,341,259 From \$106,000,000 Peak

Completion of payment of the June debt amortization and interest on Westchester County's outstanding bonded indebtedness has brought the total down from its peak of \$106,000,000 to \$90,341,259, it has been announced by County Finance Commissioner, Herbert G. Gerlach.

This reduces the county's debt to the lowest it has been since 1922. It was at that time that the debt jumped from \$66,000,000 to \$99,000,000, continuing to increase because of commitments made prior to the depression for public improvements which had reached the 1922 peak mentioned above.

Small debt service is now down to around 42 per cent. Small bond issues are to be paid off later this year, amounting to \$100 in sewer and home relief bonds.

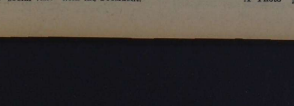

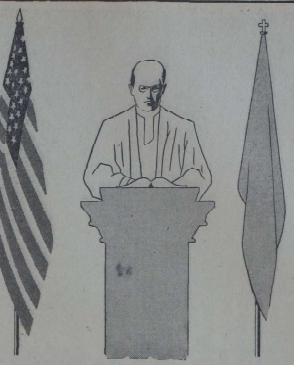
