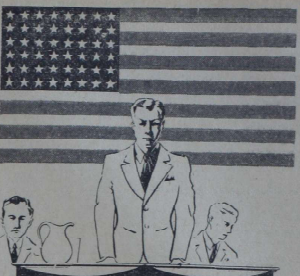

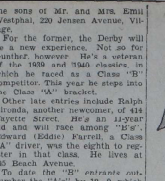

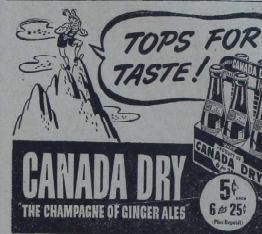

NOW TAKES SHAPE

Warplane Goal Set at 50,000; Heavy Bomber Objective 500 Monthly

WASHINGTON.—The billions of dollars being poured into aircraft purchases by the government have begun to turn a picture indicative of the broad military defense strategy contemplated by the armed services if the United States is forced into war.

The warplane objective is something less than 50,000 machines. The "colliers" or long-range, goal is around 80,000.

The heavy bomber objective is 500 a month. The directive is that category is 1,000.

The present purpose is (1) giving England a stronger air offensive weapon and (2) maintaining the offensive strength of this land.

But there is something more behind the drive for greater bomber production.

Well-informed persons in Washington say this government is giving itself against the possibility that the European war may on any day in the future, resolve itself into an inter-hemisphere air battle.

Both Army and Navy men take with a confidential air of confidence that, even if this country should be drawn into war in the next few months, either Europe or America would not be in any immediate danger of transatlantic bomber raids.

Neither this country, nor its potential enemies, has aircraft with ranges long enough to fly the ocean and return to their bases. At the moment at least, such raids would be a technical impossibility on the Atlantic frontier, much less on the Pacific.

But engineers are designing planes with greater cruising ranges. The new Douglas B-19 bomber, a plane with a fully loaded weight of some 30 tons, is a step in that direction. The B-19 is loaded with enough range, with its top load, to reach Europe and return if and when the right tests are successful, but it is too slow for tactical employment.

Germany is credited with building some extraordinary long-range bombers, notably the Heinkel "Kaiser," but military circles here is that the planes developed from a home-to-home commercial airplane, has a long way to go in reaching a point in sustained flight where it can cross the Atlantic ocean.

Of more immediate concern to the American arm services than the possibility of transatlantic air raids is the chance that, in wartime, bases might be established in proximity to the continents of this hemisphere from which raids by air could be carried out.

American long-range bomber production is being concentrated on the Boeing B-27 and the Consolidated B-24, both in the 20-ton class and both capable of cruising speeds in excess of 200 miles an hour.

From the tactical use of these planes lessons will be learned which will be applied to the construction of longer-range craft for hemisphere defense and, if necessary, transoceanic operations. Concurrent with those studies will be experiments in the construction of seaborne-based planes designed to operate in bombing operations at ranges above 30,000 feet.

Some aviation engineers contend that the production of such planes finally will bring air warfare into a home-to-home bomber battle because interceptor pilots, depending on artificial oxygen supplies taken through the mouth and nose, will be unable to stand the strain of attacking enemy bombers.

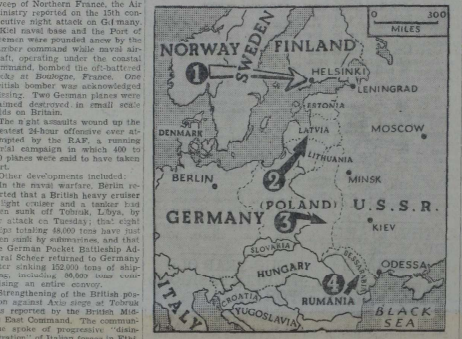
